C. <u>Report on Senate Bill 1445 Concerning</u> <u>Attendance Zones in the City of La Palma</u>

ACTION/INFORMATION ITEM

California State Senator Thomas Harman has introduced Senate Bill 1445, which would require school districts serving the City of La Palma to, upon request of the parent or guardian who resides within La Palma city limits, enroll their children in one of the district's schools without regard to school district boundaries. The City of La Palma is served by five school districts, including three different high schools in Buena Park, Cypress, and La Palma. Currently, students residing in La Palma who are within boundaries of other school districts may enroll in the Anaheim Union High School District by requesting an attendance permit. On February 21, 2008, the La Palma City Council passed a resolution in support of the bill. The proposed bill is tentatively scheduled for consideration before the Senate Education Committee in mid April and, depending on the outcome, would then proceed through the legislative process. The exhibit to this item includes the proposed bill, a copy of the La Palma City Resolution on the bill, and a map that illustrates the attendance zone impacted by the bill. **[EXHIBIT A]**

Recommendation:

No specific board action is recommended. The board may vote to formally endorse, or oppose, the proposed bill, or may take no action at this time.

D. <u>Resolution, Classified Reduction in Force</u> (Roll Call Vote)

ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to adopt Resolution No. 2007/08-HR-9, to reduce or discontinue particular kinds of classified personnel services, pursuant to Education Code Sections 44949 and 44955. This is the third in a series of actions that the board has considered to address anticipated reductions in district income because of a state-wide budget crisis. The board recently took similar action that impacted certificated, certificated management, and other classified positions. **[EXHIBIT B]**

Recommendation:

E. Contract, CSU Fullerton Auxiliary Services Corporation

ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to approve the contract with CSU Fullerton Auxiliary Services Corporation (ASC) to provide training to Anaheim Union High School District earth science teachers. The 2007-08 school year was the first time our district offered earth science to 9th grade students. The Science Department from CSUF provided training last year for earth science teachers to support their instructional practice and expand their knowledge base. The training has been an overwhelming success. Earth science teachers began the training in the summer and have faithfully attended numerous weekend sessions. Dr. Carlson, CSUF professor and lead trainer, has been requested by our teachers to offer another series of trainings to continue assisting them in deepening their understanding of earth science concepts, and

expand their ability to provide project-based instruction to their students. Services will be provided July 1, 2008, through June 30, 2009, at a cost not to exceed \$17,000. **[EXHIBIT C]**

Recommendation:

Approve the contract with CSU Fullerton Auxiliary Services Corporation. (Title II Funds)

F. Rescind E-Rate Contract with Blue Violet Networks

At the special board meeting on January 29, 2008, the Board of Trustees accepted and awarded the E-Rate, Year 11 contracts for Priority I Services, and Priority II Services and Equipment. As district staff was preparing to issue a contract to Blue Violet Networks, a number of irregularities were noticed by staff in the information submitted by Blue Violet Networks, which were inconsistent with the terms of the district's stated requirements. Therefore, staff is requesting that the Board of Trustees rescind the award of contract to Blue Violet Networks.

I. <u>Student Accident Insurance Program</u>

ACTION ITEM

In previous years, as part of the district's participation in a property/liability Joint Powers Authority (JPA), an excess student accident insurance program was provided to assist parents with medical and dental expenses when their child was injured at school or during supervised

school activities. The program was designed to minimize, or eliminate, legal claims filed by parents against the district. Since the district is no longer part of the JPA, the student accident insurance program is not available, and a replacement program is much needed. (The student accident insurance program should not be confused with the voluntary optional student accident insurance program offered to students during registration.) Under the district's student accident insurance program, the parent's private insurance coverage would pay claims on a primary basis, and the district's program would pay as secondary coverage, capped at \$5,000 of reasonable and customary expenses per claim. Without this type of program, the district would be exposed to greater claims costs, since medical expenses and settlements are not capped, and there would be additional legal defense costs and fees. It is estimated, based on our experience of 10-15 claims per school year, a fully-insured program would cost the district approximately \$70,000. In comparison, claims costs for the self-insured program would be budgeted at \$25,000, plus claims administration and investigation costs and expenses.

Recommendation:

Approve the implementation of a district self-funded excess student accident insurance program, as a cost containment effort, to minimize or eliminate potential for litigation against the district and limit the district's liability to \$5,000 of adjusted costs, per claim, as established by the program structure. J. <u>Student Accident Insurance Administration Agreement,</u> Claim Retention Services

ACTION ITEM

Government Code Section 53060 authorizes public agencies to contract with specially trained, experienced, and competent persons for professional services. The Board of Trustees is requested to ratify an agreement with Claim Retention Services (CRS), the district's current third party administrator (TPA) for property/liability claims, to supervise and administer the student accident insurance program. Claims administration services would begin February 1, 2008, and continue through January 31, 2009, at an annual cost not to exceed \$3,000, plus expenses and additional investigative expenses. **[EXHIBIT G]**

Recommendation:

Ratify the agreement with Claim Retention Services to supervise and administer the district's student accident insurance program and to provide investigative services. (General Funds)

A. Consulting Agreements, Charles Brady and Philip Rhoden

The following consulting agreements are needed for implementation of the Anaheim Union High School District Teaching American History Grant. The consultants will provide professional development on Document Based Questions (DBQ) designed to assist teachers in developing techniques to teach and assess U.S. history essays. The Teaching American History Grant was written to provide quality professional development in curriculum and instruction for traditional

American History in order to strengthen the quality of teaching standards-based American History to 8th and 11th grade students. During this final year of the grant, content and instruction identified through a district needs assessment will be addressed. Emphasis will be placed on coaching a group of teacher leaders who were identified as capable of sustaining and disseminating project efforts beyond the life of the grant.

The American History Grant is almost exclusively for training of teachers by university professors and other consultants with unique subject matter expertise and/or expertise in particular teaching methodologies. The consultants are paid with grant proceeds that may not be used for other purposes.

Recommendation:

Approve the consulting agreements listed. (Teaching American History Grant Funds)

- 1. Charles Brady, consultant, to provide Document Based Questions (DBQ) designed to assist teachers in developing techniques to teach and assess U.S. history essays. Services will be provided May 22, 2008, at a cost not to exceed \$1,200. **[EXHIBIT H]**
- 2. Philip Rhoden, consultant, to provide Document Based Questions (DBQ) designed to assist teachers in developing techniques to teach and assess U.S. history essays. Services will be provided May 22, 2008, at a cost not to exceed \$1,200. [EXHIBIT I]

B. Consulting Agreement, Dr. Mario Nuñez

Dr. Mario Nuñez will teach Anaheim Union High School District Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) students how to play string instruments, as well as the fundamentals of string playing. Dr. Nuñez is a string instrument specialist with a doctorate in string pedagogy and 26 years of teaching experience. Each student will be assigned to a violin, viola, cello, or bass. The consultant will review holding the bow, using left hand fingers, playing in tune, reading notation, counting rhythmically, and playing musical pieces.

The consultant fee is paid through GATE funding, which has been allocated by the state for this and similar GATE learning experiences. Services provided October 3, 2007, through May 30, 2008, at a cost not to exceed \$2,500. **[EXHIBIT J]**

Recommendation:

Ratify the consulting agreement with Dr. Mario Nuñez. (GATE Funds)

C. Consulting Agreement, Kate Reid

Approve the consulting agreement with Kate Reid as clinician for the AUHSD High School Pops Festival. Ms. Reid will share her expertise with both students and staff in regards to professional performance requirements. Ms. Reid will also provide insight on their achievement of the choral music standards and areas of improvement. Outside consultation for performances of this nature are essential in order to more clearly define areas of success and areas of needs for achievement of the choral music standards. Services will be provided on May 2, 2008, at a cost not to exceed \$250. **[EXHIBIT K]**

Recommendation:

Approve the consulting agreement with Kate Reid. (Vocal Music Funds)

D. 2008-09 Carl D. Perkins Application

Approve the submission of the Carl D. Perkins Application to the California Department of Education. The grant provides funding to support approved Career Technical Education pathways through the Business and Applied Technology, Home Economics, and Industrial Technology Departments, in the areas of supplementary equipment and professional development. The estimated 2008-09 preliminary allocation is \$606,610. **[EXHIBIT L]**

Recommendation:

Approve the submission of the 2008-09 Carl D. Perkins Application to the California Department of Education. (Federal Funds)

E. Agreement for Transportation to Hope School

H. Settlement Agreement and General Release, American Electric

American Electric Company was contracted to perform electrical work on the Katella High School and Kennedy High School projects. At the time that the physical construction work was completed, there were a few final pending change orders under review. Public Contract Code Section 7107, requires that the district release any withheld contract amounts that are not being retained for minor unfinished work. The Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) requires that the district file a Notice of Completion to release these funds. A Notice of Completion for the work performed by American Electric was approved by the Board of Trustees on July 6, 2007, for Katella High School, and on August 13, 2007, for Kennedy High School. The final pending change orders were approved by the Board of Trustees on November 28, 2007, for Katella High School, and on November 28, 2007, and December 13, 2007, for Kennedy High

School. The OCDE has required this Settlement Agreement and General Release as a condition of releasing the remaining funds due to American Electric under this contract. **[EXHIBIT P]**

Recommendation:

Approve the Settlement Agreement and General Release with American Electric, which settles all claims against the district for additional work and contract time. (Measure Z Funds)
