10.3 <u>Resolution No. 2010/11-B-17, Warrant/Pass-Through Fund</u> ACTION ITEM (Roll Call Vote)

The Board of Trustees is requested to adopt Resolution No. 2010/11-B-17 to establish a Warrant/Pass-Through Fund. Recently, the California Department of Education (CDE) issued a letter to all districts concerning the accounting procedure for special education pass-through revenues. This affects the District as it relates to the Greater Anaheim Special Education Local Plan Area (GASELPA). Currently, the District receives revenue on behalf of GASELPA and then distributes the revenue to GASELPA. In a typical year, this is about \$12 million. The funds are received and disbursed from the General Fund. The CDE's recent guidance requires the District to account for pass-through revenues in a fund separate from the General Fund.

Per review of the District's accounting relationship with GASELPA, discussions with the District's auditors and staff at the Orange County Department of Education, it is recommended that a Warrant/Pass-Through Fund be established to accommodate the CDE's new requirement. GASELPA pass-through revenue would be accounted for through this new fund. The new procedure will be effective July 1, 2011. **[EXHIBIT C]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt Resolution No. 2010/11-B-17, by a roll call vote.

10.4 <u>Resolution No. 2010/11-F-01, Authorization to Sign Applications</u> ACTION ITEM <u>and Associated Documents</u> (Roll Call Vote)

10.5 Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators

The declaration permits the District to hire teachers with an emergency Cross-Cultural and Language Development (CLAD), Bilingual Cross-Cultural and Language Development (BCLAD), Language, Speech and Hearing, and Special Class Authorization, as well as interns for

subject areas that are difficult to fill. Many California districts experience shortages of teachers in these areas. [EXHIBIT E]

10.6 Award of Bid, Network Access Control, Accuvant, Inc.

Bradford Networks Solution will allow the District to perform computer health checks at the point the device enters the network. This will allow for the identification and remediation of computers infected with malware. In addition, the District will be better positioned to safely allow presenters, consultants, students, and other stakeholders to utilize District network resources. The network access solution will be implemented between May 5, 2011, and June 30, 2011, at a cost not to exceed \$77,405. (General Funds)

11.2 <u>Contract Agreement Extension for Speech and Language Services with Pacific Coast Speech Services, Inc.</u>

Approve the contract agreement extension with Pacific Coast Speech Services, Inc., to provide speech-language pathologist contract services in the District. This agreement was previously extended and Board approved on March 24, 2011, for a total cost not to exceed \$128,576, an increase of \$27,552. However, due to staffing needs earlier than anticipated, the extension will be an increase of \$30,422 (a difference of \$2,870), for a total cost not to exceed \$131,446. This extension will allow the District to continue with special pricing for all its requirements related to student polling devices. The bid also includes software that teachers use to obtain reports of the students' responses. The extension is for the final two years of a three-year contract, which would extend through June 3, 2013. (Various Funds)

11.6 <u>Student Accident & Health Insurance Programs, Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Co., Inc.</u>

Approve the student accident and health insurance programs with Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Co., Inc. Education Code Section 49470 allow school districts to make group accident insurance available on a voluntary basis for purchase by parents/guardians. Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Co., Inc., has provided student accident and health insurance programs for District students and athletes for many years. These insurance programs allow students who do not have coverage under private plans to participate in athletics and provide a supplement to a parent or guardian's private insurance for both athletes and other students. Annual materials from Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Co., Inc., are distributed to students each year during the registration process. The student accident and health insurance programs are underwritten by BCS Insurance Company and administered by Myers-Stevens & Toohey & Co., Inc. They cover school time accident insurance, full time accident insurance, and interscholastic tackle football coverage. Dental and illness insurance programs are also available. The 2011-12 insurance program costs are paid by parents/guardians who elect to obtain this voluntary coverage. The 2011-12 rates are as follows:

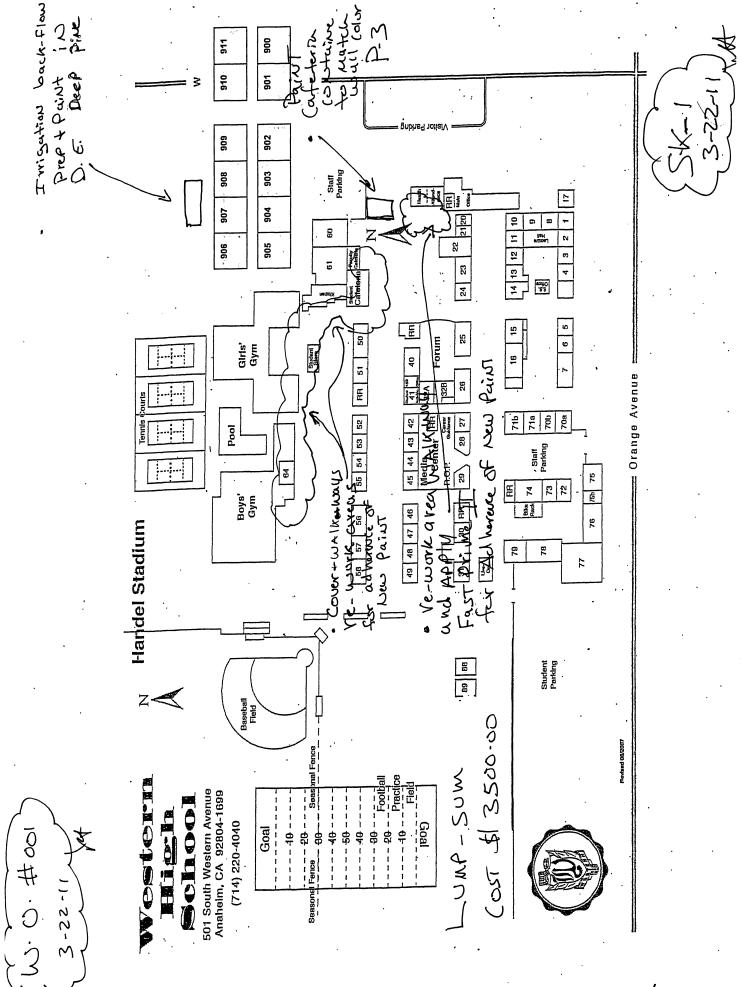

AGREEMENT TO REFER STUDENTS

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Anaheim Union High School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and The Orange County Superintendent of Schools, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR."

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR offers programs appropriate for District students;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT has reduced or eliminated certain school programs as a result of budgetary concerns and DISTICT students are in need of such services;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT desires to refer students to CONTRACTOR during each school year;

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 1294.5 allows CONTRACTOR to hire temporary certificated employees to provide services to students referred pursuant to this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Referrals by DISTRICT</u>. DISTRICT agrees to refer such students to CONTRACTOR during the term of this Agreement as are deemed to be likely to benefit from CONTRACTOR'S programs.
- 2. <u>Services to be provided by CONTRACTOR</u>. CONTRACTOR will provide services to DISTRICT students who are eligible for and enroll in CONTRACTOR'S programs during the term of this Agreement.
 - 3. <u>Term.</u> The Term of this Agreement is July 1, 2011, and ongoing until terminated.
- 4. <u>Independent Contractor.</u> CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees.
- 5. <u>Termination</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause on thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party.
- 6. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This AGREEMENT constitutes the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the AGREEMENT.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide speech and language services within the Anaheim Union High School District. As you know, Pacific Coast Speech Services, Inc. (PCSS, Inc.) has agreed to pursue a contracted therapist for the following position:

- POSITION DESCRIPTION: Pacific Coast Speech Services, Inc. will provide speech services at Cypress High School, from March 14, 2011 to March 18, 2011 and March 28 to June 9, 2011. School holidays and non-student days will be excluded unless the district requests that our clinician attend a specific meeting or in-service. Additional services can be provided if deemed necessary by district administration and/or PCSS, Inc.
- 2. PAYMENT TERMS: This district will reimburse PCSS, Inc. at the rate of \$82.00/hour, 7 hours per day for the total hours billed. Payment is due within 30 days of invoice. Contract can be cancelled or substantially reduced with 30 days notice.
- 3. District hereby acknowledges that PCSS, Inc. independent contractors are screened, hired, and trained at considerable time and expense by PCSS, Inc. District further acknowledges that PCSS, Inc. independent contractors have entered into a contractual relationship with PCSS, Inc. to provide the above services for District. District agrees that it, or any third party associated, directly or indirectly, with the District, will not hire, solicit, contract, or otherwise seek to employ PCSS, Inc. independent contractors, directly or indirectly, in such a way as to interfere with the contractual relationship between PCSS, Inc. independent contractors and PCSS, Inc., and for a period of one (1) year after the completion of an independent contractors contract with PCSS, Inc. District agrees that, acknowledging the contractual services provided by PCSS, Inc. and PCSS, Inc. subcontractors, should District desire to employ or otherwise hire the services of a particular PCSS, Inc. independent contractor within one (1) year after conclusion of an independent contractors contract, District will not directly hire said independent contractor, but will contact PCSS, Inc. for a continuation of said independent contractors services. District further agrees to indemnify PCSS, Inc. for any and all legal costs, including and without limitation, attorney fees and court costs, necessary for PCSS, Inc. to enforce this provision or any and all

attorney fees and costs resulting from proceedings arising out of violation of this provision.

4. During the term of this contract, or after the contract has been completed, Pacific Coast Speech Services, Inc.' directors or contractors may be requested or may be subpoenaed to testify or consult relating to an arbitration, mediation, deposition, trial or other type of legal proceeding. Pacific Coast Speech Services, Inc.' directors or contractors may also be requested or subpoenaed to a conference with an attorney to render an opinion, to review documentation, or take part in any other type of pre-trial, pre-mediation, or pre-arbitration discovery or research. Should this request or subpoena take place, the district will be billed for and agrees to pay the standard hourly rate to Pacific Coast Speech Services, Inc. for the time spent by the directors or contractors for these services. The standard hourly rate is set forth in this Agreement at paragraph #2.

Based on the above, we approximate that the total cost of PCSS, Inc.'s services will not exceed \$30,422.00 based on 48 calendar school days. This is not a lump sum guarantee, but a budgetary number only.

This agreement is subject to the availability of a credentialed speech therapist, and assumes a caseload equivalent to no more than 60 students for one traditional year FTE. If an audit of the caseload by the credentialed therapist reveals an excess of this 60-student equivalent, you will be notified immediately. Adjustment in reimbursement or caseload will be made within 15 calendar days.

2010-11 Goals:

(1) Articulation agreements for each of the industry pathways will be established at one or more of the local community colleges, which allow students to accelerate or earn dual credit.

Instructors from several of our pathways participate in the CTEoc Industry Advisory articulation sessions. Formal agreements are in place for some, and still in progress with others.

- a. Accounting articulation agreement with Coastline Community College.
- b. Construction (BITA) articulation agreement with Fullerton College
- c. Still pursuing agreements for Media Arts, Culinary Arts, Performing Arts, Automotive, and Protective Services.
- (2) Integration of core academic and CTE standards and skills will be developed through each of the industry pathway courses.
 - a. Both ROP and district CTE instructors participated in an all-day training on CTE Literacy Support Workshop. Literacy coaches provided hands-on literacy strategies to support the language development needs in industry specific CTE pathways. CTE teachers are receiving follow-up coaching from both the literacy coaches and their site LDS (Lesson Design Specialist) coach.
 - b. Health/Medical Pathway instructors, Math teachers, and Science teachers have been recruited through a Pipeline Grant with Cypress College to collaborate on designing integrated, cross-curricular lesson focused on the Health & Medical Pathways. These lessons will be implemented by the participating instructors, and through the grant, shared on a national level.

- (3) The UC Regents will grant A-G approval for courses articulated in the Accounting and Entrepreneurship pathways leading to two more fully developed Programs of Study.
 - a. A team of teachers have been recruited by the UC Regents to develop CTE courses that meet the different A-G requirements. To date, Digital Animation has been approved as an "A" requirement.
 - b. Financial Literacy Mathematics is still being developed and piloted at one of our high schools.
 - c. Accounting I and Accounting II are still being developed.
 - d. Virtual Enterprise has received A-G approval for "G".
- (4) All CTE students will be provided additional academic support to increase student achievement and graduation rates.
 - a. Several CTE teachers received the electronic version of <u>USA Today's</u> Career Exploration news editions. Literacy development activities are reinforced through Career focused content.
 - b. Additionally, CTE students have access to skill-building support software, ALEKS (math) and MyACCESS (writing).
- (5) End-of-program certification, through industry assessments, will be implemented for each of the industry pathways.
 - a. All pathways have identified the industry appropriate certification required or compile a Certificate of Completion listing competencies and/or Resume.
 - b. CTE teachers and students are being certified in:
 - i. <u>Accounting</u> IRS Tax Preparation (basic and intermediate levels). Students and teachers host Community Tax Days providing income tax filing for low-income clients. This program is done through the VITA program (United Way).
 - ii. Culinary Arts Safe-Serv certification
 - iii. Media Arts Final Cut Pro (MAC) or Adobe Premier (PC)
 - iv. Information Support Microsoft Certified Application Specialist
 - v. Therapeutic Certified Nursing Assistant State Board Exams
 - vi. <u>Protective Services</u> CPR, First Aid, Certified Emergency Responder Teen (CERT)
 - vii. Construction Construction Certificates / Licenses
- (6) A district-wide recognition procedure will be developed and implemented for CTE students completing an industry program of study.

All high school principals and their guidance counselor met with the district CTE Coordinator, assistant superintendent, ROP administration to discuss and plan for a CTE Graduation Cord program. Rigorous criteria was established to ensure quality control across all district programs. Two high schools will be piloting the CTE cords for Graduation 2011.

2. During the 2010–11 school year, what opportunities were provided to teachers to ensure they were current and up to date with their own technical skills?

All CTE teachers, both general education and ROP, are given the opportunity to attend industry-related workshops and/or trainings. Our county-wide partnership through PLCoc and Vital Link provide all-day industry-specific workshops and advisory meetings. This year, culinary, transportation, engineering, business, and digital media attended these workshops. Additionally, three more accounting teachers earned IRS Tax Preparation certification. There are now a total of five accounting teachers certified and hosting "Community Tax Days" along side their IRS certified students. Two or our culinary arts teachers have earned the Serv-Safe certification and are active members of the Culinary PLCoc professional learning community. A JROTC instructor teaching in a protective services pathway recently earned certification in CERT (Certified Emergency Responder Team). He is continuing on for his "trainer-of-trainer" certification. This will allow him to be a CERT trainer for both students and other protective services instructors. Another Biotechnology Research & Development pathway is in the planning stages for next school year. Several teachers participated in exploring strong programs, making industry contacts, and planning for implementation.

All CTE teachers attended an all-day CTE Literacy workshop. Teachers worked with literacy experts learning effective strategies supporting the language development needs for their students trying to learning their industry-specific content. A site-by-site follow-up coaching model is planned for next school year.

3. What process is used to annually evaluate the effectiveness of the CTE programs? Who is involved in the evaluation?

The district CTE Coordinator, ROP administration, and site principals jointly share the responsibility for the overall quality-control of each CTE pathway. As a team, they arranged and conducted a joint visitation to each CTE classroom on each high school site. The classroom walk-throughs in the fall identified the literacy instructional support needs observed in each classroom. These collaborative visits resulted in the planning and delivery of the CTE Literacy Workshop conducted in the early Spring. The team also met by individual school sites with the assistant superintendent from ROP and the district assistant superintendent to discuss each pathway on each campus and to begin the planning for any changes for next school year.

Additionally, the CTE Coordinator, meets with teachers from each pathway 2 to 3 times a year, including attending industry advisory meetings hosted by vital Link. Course sequencing for each pathway is aligned by support of the state CTE program. CTE pathway teachers collaborate on lesson-designing and identifying appropriate industry certification for students.

The CTE Coordinator and a Guidance Counselor at each site is responsible for monitoring each CTE pathway. The counselor is responsible for the recruiting of students into each pathway and providing the guidance needed to be successful.

A formal assessment of program effectiveness, as outlined by the state criteria, will be conducted during the 2011-12 school year.

7.3 PTSA Report

Ms. Jenks also stated they are working hard on the Tax Revenue Extension Measure. She urged parents and students to call elected officials.

10.7 <u>Resolution Nos. 2010/11-B-10 and 2010/11-B-11, Adjustments to Income, Expenditures, and Fund Balances; and 2010-11 Second Interim Report</u>

On the motion of Mrs. Piercy and duly seconded, following discussion, the Board of Trustees certified, in writing, whether or not the District is able to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year and based on current forecasts for two subsequent fiscal years. The certifications shall be classified as positive, qualified, or negative, pursuant to the standards and criteria adopted by the State Board of Education, Education Code Section 33127.

In certifying the 2010-11 Second Interim Report as positive, the Board understands its fiduciary responsibility to maintain fiscal solvency for the current and subsequent two fiscal years. Due to the depletion of one-time revenue in 2010-11 and a decrease in the Revenue Limit, the District will implement in 2011-12 approximately \$13 million and an additional

\$20.5 million in 2012-13 in ongoing budget reductions to maintain the positive certification. It is further recognized that the District will submit a detailed list of Board approved budget reductions for 2011-12 with the adopted budget for the 2011-12 fiscal year.

As part of the interim reporting process, budget adjustments are made to income, expenditures, and fund balances. Resolution No. 2010/11-B-10, General Fund, and Resolution No. 2010/11-B-11, Various Funds, authorize budget adjustments per Education Code Sections 42602 and 42610.

The roll call vote follows.

10.8 Resolution No. 2010/11-B-12, Tax Revenue Anticipation Notes (TRANs)

On the motion of Mr. O'Neal and duly seconded, the Board of Trustees adopted Resolution No. 2010/11-B-12, Tax Revenue Anticipation Notes (TRANs), authorizing the borrowing of funds for fiscal year 2011-12, not to exceed \$40,000,000 cumulative for the year. This resolution allows for multiple issuances if necessary, which in total cannot exceed \$40,000,000. TRANs are short-term, interest-bearing notes issued by a district in anticipation of taxes and other revenues. The actual cost of the TRANs will be calculated once the number of final participants and costs are known. There is no cost to the District unless a TRANs is issued. TRANs are often used by school districts to cover brief cash flow shortages. The TRANs funds will be paid back using state apportionments. Please note that the exhibit is incomplete and will not be completed until the transaction is finalized. However, we are requested by the Piper Jaffray & Co., financial advisor, to supply the documents to the Board with the blank portions now.

To cope with its own cash flow problems the state of California has deferred payment of revenue apportionments to school districts. This has created cash flow problems for many districts. Passing this resolution does not obligate the District to use a TRANs. However, it does allow the District to pursue a TRANs if it appears necessary.

10.9 Resolution No. 2010/11-B-13, Temporary Interfund Transfer

On the motion of Mrs. Piercy and duly seconded, the Board of Trustees adopted Resolution No. 2010/11-B-13, Temporary Interfund Transfer. As part of the state's solution to its own cash flow problems, it has deferred the payment of revenue limit apportionment to school districts from the year in which it is normally received, to the following year. Approximately thirty-three percent of the revenue limit apportionment that would normally be received in 2010-11 will now be deferred to 2011-12. For the District, this is approximately \$44,000,000. It is anticipated that the deferrals for the 2011-12 fiscal year will be the same, or possibly larger.

This resolution will provide as much flexibility as possible for 2011-12 within the District's cash resources. This resolution will allow for temporary interfund cash transfers from the Deferred Maintenance Funds, Capital Outlay Funds, Special Reserve Funds, and Self-Insurance Funds to the General Fund.

10.10 Resolution 2010/11-B-14, Signature Authorization

In accordance with Education Code Section 42633, the governing board of each school district shall be responsible for filing or causing to be filed with the county superintendent of schools the verified signature of each person authorized to sign orders in its name.

Except for districts determined to be fiscally accountable pursuant to Education Code Section 42650, no order on the funds of any school district shall be approved by the county superintendent of schools unless the signatures are on file in his office, and he is satisfied that the signatures on the order are those of persons authorized to sign the order.

The Orange County Department of Education requires that all designated personnel authorized to sign various documents and as listed on the attached resolution be approved by the Board of Education. Since there have been recent changes in administrative personnel, the District is updating the signature authorization.

A committee consisting of principals, assistant principals, teachers, site technicians, administrators, and community members was developed to represent varying areas of knowledge and expertise. This committee assisted in the development and review of the audio visual equipment standards, making the process invaluable to the District. The bid will be in effect for three years, approved annually by the District's assistant superintendent of business or designee.

10.12 Award of P.E. Equipment and Supplies Bid

10.15 Request to Bid Anti-Virus Malware Software Using PCC 20118.2

On the motion of Mr. O'Neal, duly seconded and unanimously carried, following discussion, the Board of Trustees approved the request to bid anti-virus malware software. The Information Systems Department is requesting to proceed with a project to update the District's anti-virus malware software. The District has used its existing product for almost ten years and has had multiple virus outbreak issues the last fifteen months. PCC 20118.2 states, "Due to the highly specialized and unique nature of technology, telecommunications, related equipment, software, and services, because products and materials of that nature are undergoing rapid technological changes, and in order to allow for the introduction of new technological changes into the operations of the school district, it is in the public's best interest to allow a school district to consider, in addition to price, factors such as vendor financing, performance reliability, standardization, life-cycle costs, delivery timetables, support logistics, the broadest possible range of competing products and materials available, fitness of purchase, manufacturer's warranties, and similar factors in the award of contracts for technology, telecommunications, related equipment, software, and services." (General Funds)

Aeries Software, Inc., provides the student information system (SIS) software for the following programs: student profile, attendance, discipline, teacher grade book/posting of grades, teacher information, the master schedule, and a variety of queries. Servite staff requires additional training in order to develop the 2011-12 master schedule. The District is required to extend certain federal categorical program resources to private schools. Services will be provided on March 11, 2011, at a cost not to exceed \$2,000. (Title II Funds)

11.1.2 UC Regents/UCLA School Management Program

The Board of Trustees ratified the educational consulting agreement amendment with UC Regents/UCLA School Management Program (SMP), to expand services to school site administrative and teacher leadership teams. This is a requirement for school districts that are involved in Program Improvement (PI), as outlined in No Child Left Behind (NCLB). SMP serves as the District's NCLB PI service provider. SMP has been working with targeted schools to identify and create structures and processes that assure continuous improvement of both student learning and professional practice. Schools have requested additional training and on-site coaching, which has resulted in an increased cost of services. The increased cost of \$45,000 is needed to complete services through June 30, 2011. The total cost is not to exceed \$395,000, for services provided November 30, 2009, through June 30, 2011. (Title I Funds)

All topics focus on academic success and include the role of the family, self-esteem, and the building blocks for academic success. Services will be provided April 19, 2011, through June 7, 2011, at a cost not to exceed \$10,000. Professional development of this nature is a requirement of the federally-funded Title I Program, and such funds may not be used for other purposes. (Title I Parent Involvement Funds)

All topics focus on academic success and include the role of the family, self-esteem, and the building blocks for academic success. Services will be provided April 27, 2011, through June 13, 2011, at a cost not to exceed \$10,000. Professional development of this nature is a requirement of the federally-funded Title I Program, and such funds may not be used for other purposes. (Title I Parent Involvement Funds)

Certificated layoffs are governed primarily by Education Code Section 44949. The following information summarizes aspects of this code section:

- No later than March 15, an employee is given notice that his or her services may not be required for the ensuing year.
- The employee may request a hearing to determine if there is cause for not reemploying him or her for the ensuing year.

• The employee has certain reemployment rights for a period of time following the date of termination.
