Representatives from the Ronald Simon Family Foundation and Ben Sanchez, principal of Anaheim High School, will present the ten Anaheim High School sophomore students selected as Simon Scholars. The Ronald Simon Family Foundation high school scholarship program is very unique, as it begins supporting students in their sophomore year. Students selected as Simon Scholars receive in excess of \$16,000 in programs, services, and support during high school. Upon graduation from high school, Simon Scholars that have met all of the requirements of the program will then receive an additional \$16,000 college scholarship. #### 10.3 Agreement, SCHOOLDUDE.COM, Inc.

The district uses the SchoolDude products for all of its maintenance and technical work orders and all of its facilities scheduling. This action continues the use of all of the SCHOOLDUDE.COM, Inc. solutions (IT Direct Service, FSDirect Service, MySchoolDude Service, and MaintenanceDirect Service) for 2010-11, at a cost not to exceed \$25,689. ### 10.4 <u>Service Agreement, CTAP Educational Technology Showcase Grant</u> ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to ratify a service agreement with the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) to implement the award of a California Technology Assistance Project (CTAP) Educational Technology Showcase Grant to Stephen Smith, teacher at John F. Kennedy High School. The Educational Technology Showcase Grant is funded by CTAP, Region 9, and administered through the OCDE. The goal of the grant is to support the enhancement and extension of teaching and learning in Orange County public

schools through curricular integration of technology. As the administering body, the OCDE drafted and issued the agreement to the district for approval with no opportunity for the district to negotiate terms or conditions. The contract was drafted by OCDE and signed on April 9, 2010. Services are being provided from April 15, 2010, through June 30, 2011. The agreement must be approved prior to May 29, 2010, because the district only has until that date to invoice the OCDE for the grant amount. The district will not commit any funds until the monies have been received from the OCDE. Materials must be ordered no later than August 30, 2010. The amount of the agreement is not to exceed \$7,000. (State Funds) **[EXHIBIT D]** 

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the service agreement.

#### 10.5 **Essential Facility Projects**

**ACTION ITEM** 

At the January 14, 2010, board meeting, the board asked staff to postpone a number of facility improvements and construction projects because of the fiscal crisis confronting all public agencies. The board also asked that essential projects be brought back to the board for further consideration. The exhibit to this item describes a number of critical projects, which should be undertaken in the next few months, and completed prior to the opening of the 2010-11 year. Most of the projects are funded by restricted accounts that have routinely been used each year to address needed facility replacements, enhancements, or safety concerns. Many of the projects concern preparation and relocation of portable classrooms throughout the district. The relocation project was undertaken over the past two years to save district funds by eliminating and moving rental units. **[EXHIBIT E]** 

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the projects.

#### 11.1 Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators

Approve the Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators, as required by the State Commission on Teacher Credentialing. The Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators is a requirement established by the State Commission on Teacher Credentialing, to permit the district to employ certificated staff members in certain identified areas of need. The declaration permits the district to hire teachers with an emergency Cross-Cultural and Language Development (CLAD), Bilingual Cross-Cultural and Language Development (BCLAD), Language, Speech and Hearing, and Special Class Authorization, as well as interns for subject areas that are difficult to fill. Many California districts experience shortages of teachers in these areas of need. **[EXHIBIT H]** 

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the Declaration of Need for Fully Oualified Educators.

#### 11.2 Educational Consulting Agreement Amendment, Alternatives Unlimited, Inc.

Approve the educational consulting agreement amendment with Alternatives Unlimited, Inc., a Supplemental Educational Services (SES) provider. The services are a requirement of the of the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) of 2001, for schools in years two through five of Program Improvement (PI). Ball, Brookhurst, Dale, Orangeview, South, and Sycamore Junior High Schools are offering the supplemental tutoring services to low-income students. An increase in the original amount, for Alternatives Unlimited, Inc., is requested as a result of increased parent demand. Services are being provided November 2, 2009, through May 15, 2010. The original approved amount on October 15, 2009, was not to exceed \$30,000. The amended amount is at a cost not to exceed \$55,000. (Title I Funds) [EXHIBIT I]

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the educational consulting agreement amendment.

# 11.3 <u>Grant Award Amendment, Workforce Investment Act, Title II: Adult Education</u> <u>Family Literacy Act, Section 225, Section 231, and English Literacy and Civics</u> <u>Education</u>

Approve the request to accept an amended notification of an award for the Workforce Investment Act (WIA), Title II: Adult Education Family Literacy Act, Section 225, Section 231, and English Literacy and Civics Education Grant. This funding supports programs for adult education students enrolled in basic education, English as a second language, citizenship, general education development (GED), and high school diploma programs. The original award amount of \$89,816 was board approved on December 10, 2009. The amended increase is \$18,654, for a new total award amount of \$108,470. Grant funds must be expended by June 30, 2010. (WIA Funds) **[EXHIBIT J]** 

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees accept the grant award amendment.

#### 11.4 Agreement, Orange County Superintendent of Schools

Ratify the agreement with the Orange County Superintendent of Schools, contractor, for the provision of Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS) and Violence Prevention Education Services training. The listed employees in the contract attended the March 31, 2010, training sponsored by Orange County Department of Education (OCDE). This agreement enables OCDE to reimburse the district up to \$100 per attendee for any incurred expenses, at a cost not to exceed \$5,100. (General Funds) [EXHIBIT K]

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the agreement.

#### 11.5 Service Agreement, Sungard Bi-Tech System Support

Ratify service agreement amendment #4 with the Orange County Superintendent of Schools for Sungard Bi-Tech System support. The Sungard Bi-Tech System support covers basic financial/budget, school site finance, stores inventory, and fixed asset systems, July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$94,336. (General Funds) [EXHIBIT L]

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the agreement.

#### 11.6 Service Agreement, Sungard Bi-Tech Human Resources System Support

Ratify the service agreement with the Orange County Superintendent of Schools for Sungard Bi-Tech Human Resources System support. The Anaheim Union High School District contracts with the Orange County Superintendent of Schools to provide annual software support services for the Sungard Bi-Tech Human Resources System. The contract provides for an annual evaluation of support service charges for possible upward or downward adjustments, based on the Orange County Superintendent of School's actual costs, to support the Sungard Bi-Tech Human Resources System, July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$76,523. (General Funds) [EXHIBIT M]

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the agreement.

#### 11.7 Agreements, Extension of Inter-Agency Meal Agreements

Extend the meal agreements with inter-agencies. The district is required to renew meal agreements each year in order to continue providing meals to the Anaheim City School District, Anaheim City School District Preschool Program, and the Anaheim City School District Headstart Program. These agreements generate income from the meals served. Services will be provided July 1, 2010, through June 30, 2011. (Cafeteria Funds) [EXHIBITS N, O, and P]

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees extend the agreements.

# 11.8 <u>Student Accident and Health Insurance Programs, Myers-Stevens and Toohey</u> and Co., Inc.

Approve the student accident and health insurance programs with Myers-Stevens and Toohey and Co., Inc. Education Code Section 49470 allows school districts to make group accident insurance available on a voluntary basis for purchase by parents/guardians. Myers-

Stevens and Toohey and Co., Inc. has provided student accident and health insurance programs for district students and athletes for many years. These insurance programs allow students who do not have coverage under private plans to participate in athletics, and provide a supplement to a parent or guardian's private insurance for both athletes and other students. Annual materials from Myers-Stevens and Toohey and Co., Inc. are distributed to students each year during the registration process. The student accident and health insurance programs are underwritten by BCS Insurance Company and administered by Myers-interscholastic tackle football coverage. Dental and illness insurance programs are also available. The 2010-11 insurance program costs are paid by parents/guardians who elect to obtain this voluntary coverage. The 2010-11 rates are as follows:

#### 11.9 Piggyback Bids, Purchase Through Public Corporation or Agency

Approve the purchases as listed, through public corporation or agency, per Public Contract Code Sections 20118, 10298, 10299, and 12100 et. seq. allowing public entities to acquire various products by participating in an existing contract of another public entity, which is commonly known as piggybacking.

Piggyback bids provide an opportunity to purchase the designated items from various funding sources. This is why no specific funding source is designated. Additionally, because the formal bid is described in documents from the original bidding organization, the district is not required to develop a separate bid or contract with the vendor, and none is provided or exhibited.

By piggybacking onto another district's existing bid, our district can take advantage of lower costs through economy-of-scale, and also avoid the time and expense of the public bid process. At this time, staff has analyzed purchasing options for computer related products, equipment and services, and audio visual products. It has been determined that the following bids can be utilized to acquire these products at their best value:

11.9.1 California CMAS-Agreement #3-04-70-0225H for Computer Related Products, Equipment and Services-Sehi Computer Products, Inc., through August 31, 2012.

- 11.9.2 Santa Ana Unified School District—Bid #1-10 Authorization to Award Contracts for Purchase of Audio Visual Equipment and Computer Supplies district wide (GBC, GovConnection, Intelli-Tech, Lightspeed, Sehi Computer Products, Inc., Sierra w/o Wires, Inc., Troxell Communications, Inc., and Western Blue Corporation) current contract through October 13, 2010, for up to two years upon extension by contracting agency.
- 11.9.3 Santa Ana Unified School District—Bid #9-10 Authorization to Award Contract for Purchase of LCD Projectors district wide (Intelli-Tech) current contract through January 26, 2011, for up to two years upon extension by contracting agency.
- 11.9.4 Redlands Unified School District-Bid #19-08 Audio Visual Equipment (Troxell Communications, Inc.) current contract through October 28, 2010, for up to one year upon extension by contracting agency.

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the piggyback bids as listed.

AGREEMENT NUMBER 35503

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#### ANAHEIM UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT SERVICE AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into this 9th day of April, 2010, by and between the Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa, California 92626, hereinafter referred to as SUPERINTENDENT, and the Anaheim Union High School District, 501 Crescent Way, Anaheim, California 92801, hereinafter referred to as DISTRICT. SUPERINTENDENT and DISTRICT shall be collectively referred to as the Parties.

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT has been awarded the California Technology Assistance Project (CTAP) grant funds from the State of California for the Educational Technology Program, hereinafter referred to as PROGRAM; and

grant requires that SUPERINTENDENT WHEREAS, the PROGRAM allocate a portion of the PROGRAM grant funds to support the goals and activities of the Educational Technology Program; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the SUPERINTENDENT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

SCOPE OF WORK. SUPERINTENDENT hereby engages DISTRICT as an independent contractor to perform the following described work and DISTRICT hereby agrees to perform said work upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth. Specifically, DISTRICT shall provide the following services as described in the California Technology Assistance Program (CTAP) Student Technology Grant Winners,

Grant Award Specifications for 2010, attached as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.

- 1.1 Participants must implement and complete all Showcase grant activities pursuant to grant applications and project evaluation during fiscal year 2010-2011.
- 1.2 Grant award money is to be spent only on Showcase grant activities, equipment, software, materials, subscriptions or any other resources defined in the budget section of the budgets submitted with their winning grants.
- 1.3 The Grant Completion Form, attached as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference, shall be completed and submitted to SUPERINTENDENT'S designee by or before June 5, 2011.
- 1.4 Showcase grant winners, recipients or teams will not be eligible to re-apply until one (1) complete grant year has passed since they received their award.
- 2.0 TERM. DISTRICT shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on April 15, 2010, and end on June 30, 2011, subject to termination as set forth in this AGREEMENT.
- 3.0 <u>ALLOCATION OF FUNDS</u>. DISTRICT agrees to distribute payment to each DISTRICT school teacher awarded CTAP grant funds to use to purchase cabling, hardware, software, and/or staff development activities. CTAP grant funds will be awarded to the following teacher:

\$7,000.00

Grant recipients who leave a school after receiving a Showcase Grant may take any equipment and/or software purchased with the grant funds to any other school within the district, but if he or she should leave the district, retire, take a leave of absence, or otherwise end their employment at the school, the grant equipment and materials shall stay at the last school in which the recipient was employed. Team grants will stay at the school(s) for which they were written, regardless of any recipient movements between school or districts.

#### 4.0 PAYMENT.

DISTRICT shall invoice SUPERINTENDENT for the total amount Α. of the grant award which shall not exceed Seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) for services to be satisfactorily rendered pursuant to Section 1.0 of this AGREEMENT. The invoice shall be received by SUPERINTENDENT no later than May 29, 2010. DISTRICT shall be solely responsible for reimbursement of any costs due for grant activities, equipment, software, materials, subscriptions or any other resources that exceed the total dollar amount awarded for the Showcase grant as described above. Payment shall be made to DISTRICT upon receipt and approval of an original numbered invoice in duplicate from DISTRICT which includes the following: 1) a complete description of service to be performed, and 2) date services are to be performed. Supporting documentation shall include, but not be limited to ledgers, journals, time sheets, invoices, bank statements, cancelled checks, receipts, receiving records, and records of services provided. DISTRICT shall

direct all invoices to: Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, P. O. Box 9050, Costa Mesa, California 92628-9050, Attn: Marilyn Rollins, Educational Technology Department, Educational Technology Department. Payment shall be made to DISTRICT within thirty (30) days from receipt of an accurate invoice. Payment shall be mailed to: Anaheim Union High School District, 501 Crescent Way, Anaheim, California 92801, or at such other place as DISTRICT may designate in writing. 

B. SUPERINTENDENT may withhold or delay any payment should DISTRICT fail to comply with any of the provisions set forth in this AGREEMENT.

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- C. DISTRICT shall not claim reimbursement for services provided beyond the expiration and/or termination of this AGREEMENT, except as may otherwise be provided under this AGREEMENT.
- D. The obligation of SUPERINTENDENT under this AGREEMENT is contingent upon the availability of funds furnished by the State of California. In the event that such funding is terminated or reduced, this AGREEMENT may be terminated, and SUPERINTENDENT'S fiscal obligations hereunder shall be limited to a pro-rated amount of funding actually received by the SUPERINTENDENT under the grant. SUPERINTENDENT shall provide DISTRICT written notification of such termination. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- E. Any Showcase grant funds not used by the DISTRICT shall be returned to SUPERINTENDENT'S CTAP Program designee by July 30, 2011.

5.0 EXPENSES. SUPERINTENDENT shall not be liable to DISTRICT for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by DISTRICT in performing services for SUPERINTENDENT, except as follows: N/A. DISTRICT shall be required to provide receipts for all travel related expenses.

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6.0 MATERIALS. DISTRICT shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT except as follows: N/A. DISTRICT'S services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. DISTRICT, in the performance of this 7.0 AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. understands and agrees that DISTRICT and all of DISTRICT'S employees considered officers, employees or agents shall not be of SUPERINTENDENT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the SUPERINTENDENT and/or to which SUPERINTENDENT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. DISTRICT assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of DISTRICT'S employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. DISTRICT shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes contributions, or including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to DISTRICT'S employees.

#### 8.0 HOLD HARMLESS.

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- A. SUPERINTENDENT agrees to and does hereby indemnify, defend, and hold harmless DISTRICT, its Governing Board, officers, agents and employees from liability and claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease, or death of any person or persons, or damage to any property, real personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents or officers of SUPERINTENDENT or the Orange County Board of education during the period of this AGREEMENT.
- B. DISTRICT agrees to and does hereby indemnify, defend, and hold harmless SUPERINTENDENT, the Orange County Board of Education, and its officers, agents and employees from liability and claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease, or death of any person or persons, or damage to any property, real personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of its Governing Board, employees, agents or officers of DISTRICT during the period of this AGREEMENT.
- 9.0 <u>NON-DISCRIMINATION</u>. DISTRICT agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such persons.
- 10.0 APPLICABLE LAWS. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the SUPERINTENDENT and shall be subject to the SUPERINTENDENT'S general right οf inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. DISTRICT agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that

are now or may in the future become applicable to DISTRICT, DISTRICT'S business, equipment and personnel engaged in operations covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such operations.

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11.0 PERMITS/LICENSES. DISTRICT and all DISTRICT'S employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

12.0 ASSIGNMENT. The obligations of the DISTRICT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the DISTRICT without prior written approval of SUPERINTENDENT.

13.0 INSPECTION AND AUDIT. The SUPERINTENDENT and the State of California Department of Education and their respective authorized agents, shall have access, for the purpose of audit or examination, to any records of DISTRICT pertinent to this AGREEMENT. DISTRICT shall maintain records of services provided and financial records for a period of four (4) years, unless such period is waived by SUPERINTENDENT.

14.0 TOBACCO USE POLICY. In the interest of public health, SUPERINTENDENT provides a tobacco-free environment. Smoking or the use of any tobacco products are prohibited in buildings and vehicles, and on any property owned, leased or contracted for by the SUPERINTENDENT pursuant to SUPERINTENDENT Policy 400.15. Failure to abide with conditions of this policy could result in the termination of this AGREEMENT.

Grant recipients, individuals or teams are expected to complete all grant activities pursuant to grant applications and complete a project evaluation during fiscal year 2010-2011. Each grant activity needs to be implemented in the 2010-2011 fiscal year, as there is no carryover allowed beyond June 30, 2011.

Grant recipients must communicate with their district purchasing department to determine the specific procedures and deadlines for purchasing. Grant award money is to be spent only on grant activities, equipment, software, materials, subscriptions or any other resources defined in the budget section of the budgets submitted with their winning grants. A grant completion form will be provided to recipients in the spring of 2011, which will certify that all funds have been expended in alignment with the budget submitted with each grant. A final summary of grant implementation will also be included. This Grant Completion form is due by June 5, 2011.

Grant recipients who leave a school after receiving a Showcase Grant may take any equipment and/or software purchased with the grant funds with them to any other school within the district, but if he or she should leave the district, retire, take a leave of absence, or otherwise end their employment at the school, the grant equipment and materials will stay at the last school in which the recipient was employed. Team grants will stay at the school(s) for which they were written, regardless of any recipient movements between school or districts.

All grant recipients give OCDE permission for the showcase selection committee to view the project in progress during October or November of its implementation year, and will furthermore agree to allow video cameras to capture the grant activities for the purpose of showcasing the project on the OC Technology Showcase. Additionally, grant recipients agree to sit for a brief videotaped interview regarding the grant if requested.

Grant winners, recipients or teams are not eligible to re-apply again until one complete grant year has passed since they received their award.

Districts will invoice the OCDE for the full amount of the grants awarded to teachers within that district. This may be done as a single invoice for multiple grants and may be done immediately. #### **RESPONSIBILITIES AND LEGAL AUTHORITIES OF OFFICE:**

- 1. The <u>district</u> <u>s</u>Superintendent <del>of</del> <u>Schools</u> is the chief executive officer of the Governing Board (<u>Education Code 35035</u>). (<u>Education Code 35035</u>)
- 2. The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall act as secretary to the <u>b</u>Board.
- 3. The <u>s</u>Superintendent is responsible for carrying out all policies established by the bBoard.
- 4. In cases not specifically covered by <u>b</u>Board policies, the <u>s</u>Superintendent shall take appropriate action and report such action to the <u>b</u>Board not later than the next bBoard meeting.
- 5. All individuals employed by the <u>b</u>Board are responsible to the <u>s</u>Superintendent of <del>Schools</del>.
- 6. The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall establish such regulations and give such instructions to school employees as may be necessary to make the policies of the <u>b</u>Board effective. Such delegation and assignments, however, shall not relieve the sSuperintendent of final responsibility for actions of subordinates.
- 7. The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall be present at all meetings of the <u>b</u>Board and its special committees, except when matters pertaining to his/her reemployment are being considered by the <u>b</u>Board. The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall be <u>the</u> advisor to the <u>b</u>Board in all its deliberations.
- 8. The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall be responsible for preparing and submitting the <u>d</u>District budget to the <u>b</u>Board for the ensuing fiscal year. He/She shall revise and take any other action concerning the budget as the <u>b</u>Board may designate.
- 9. The Superintendent shall submit quarterly financial and budgetary reports to the Governing Board. The report shall include any outstanding obligations incurred by the school district.
- 10. In accordance with policies of the <u>b</u>Board, the <u>s</u>Superintendent shall have the power within the limits of major appropriations approved by the <u>b</u>Board to approve and direct all purchases and expenditures.
- 11. The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall have the power to enter into any contracts on behalf of the Governing Board (<u>Education Code 35035</u>). (<u>Education Code 35035</u>) The

Governing Board shall delegate this power to the Superintendent by a majority vote. (Education Code 39656)

The Superintendent shall be personally liable for any District moneys paid out as a result of his/her misconduct in relation to any contracts made. (Education Code 39656)

- 12. In the event of malfeasance, in office the superintendent shall be personally liable to the school district for any and all moneys of the district paid out as a result of the malfeasance. (Education Code 17604)
- 13. The superintendent shall submit his/her recommendations in respect to all candidates for employment. The beard shall accept or reject such recommendations, but shall employ candidates only on the superintendent's recommendation.
- The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall determine whether certificated employees have a valid certificate as required by law (<u>Education Code 35035</u>). (<del>Education Code 35035</del>)
- The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall formulate and recommend, for the consideration of the <u>b</u>Board, personnel policies needed for efficient functioning of the <u>d</u>District staff.
- <u>16.</u> The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall assign all certificated personnel within the <u>d</u>District subject to <u>b</u>Board approval.
- <u>17.</u> The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall have the power to transfer certificated employees from one school to another. His/Her decision shall be based on the best interest of the <u>d</u>District and be consistent with the adopted <u>b</u>Board policy concerning transfers (<u>Education Code 35035</u>). (<u>Education Code 35035</u>)
- The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall provide professional leadership for the education program of the schools. He/She shall formulate educationally sound policies and present them to the <u>b</u>Board for consideration. The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall regularly report to the <u>b</u>Board on all aspects of the <u>d</u>District's education program.
- 19. The superintendent shall be responsible for the evaluation of each staff member the superintendent's executive staff.
- <u>20.</u> The <u>s</u>Superintendent is responsible for the development of a plan for maintenance, improvement, or expansion of building and site facilities.

- <u>21.</u> The <u>s</u>Superintendent is responsible for planning means of keeping the community informed about school matters. He/She shall serve as a representative of the schools before the public.
- <u>22.</u> Within budget appropriations and travel policy set by the <u>b</u>Board, the <u>s</u>Superintendent is authorized to approve travel expenses for employees on official business.
- <u>23.</u> The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall submit to the <u>b</u>Board an annual report on the operation of the school system, as well as any special reports requested by the bBoard.
- <u>24.</u> The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall keep and regularly update an inventory of all property, furnishings, material, and supplies of the <u>d</u>District.
- <u>25.</u> The <u>s</u>Superintendent shall recommend to the Governing Board a student's suspension or expulsion under the appropriate circumstances (Education Code 48900). (Education Code 48900)

#### **DUTIES OF THE SUPERINTENDENT**

- 1. Assists the Board of Trustees in the formulation of <u>d</u>District policy.
- 2. Assesses the <u>d</u>District, its environment and people, to determine its educational needs in order to recommend appropriate <u>d</u>District goals.
- 3. Establishes, implements, and evaluates appropriate programs to attain <u>d</u>District goals.
- 4. Delegates authority and responsibility for carrying out the functions of the school district.
- 5. Provides for the evaluation of the school district's programs.
- 6. Directs to the <u>b</u>Board all actions regarding employment, leave, assignment, classification, transfer, retirement, resignation, promotion, suspension, or dismissal of employees.
- 7. Maintains control of the <u>d</u>District's fiscal services involving budgeting, purchasing, and accounting.
- 8. Directs the school building program and manages the <u>d</u>District's capital assets.

- Interprets and informs staff as to state, county, and school district laws and policies, regulations, and procedures. Works with the office of the county counsel to clarify meanings of code provisions.
- 10. Directly supervises the assistant superintendents and school principals to attain the educational goals and objectives of the dDistrict and the individual schools.
- 11. Directs the community relations program of the school district providing ways in which community groups and individuals can receive desired information regarding the operation of the school district.
- 12. Provides liaison between the school district and all public and private agencies, including local, state, and federal governments, in their relations with the school district.
- 13. Participates in the work of appropriate professional education associations at the local, state, and national levels for the purpose of enhancing his/her ability to serve the Board of Trustees, staff, students, and the public.
- 14. Reports periodically to the Board of Trustees concerning all aspects of the school district goals.
- 15. Participates in appropriate community organizations and functions for the purpose of obtaining support and understanding for the attainment of the school district goals.
- 16. Represents the Board of Trustees in relationships with students, staff, parents, organizations, and citizens.
- 17. Provides leadership for the continued development of the capabilities of district staff members.
- 18. Recognizes and adheres to the ethical standards of <u>the</u> Association of California School Administrators (ACSA).
- 19. Performs other duties as the Board of Trustees may determine.

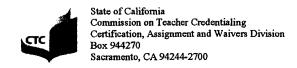

This AGREEMENT, entered into this 13th day of May, 2010, which date is enumerated for purposes of reference only, is by and between Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, Costa Mesa, California 92626, hereinafter referred to as "SUPERINTENDENT", and Anaheim Union High School District, 501 Crescent Way, Anaheim, California 92801, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT".

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT has entered into an Agreement with the COUNTY OF ORANGE, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY", to offer Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports and Violence Prevention Education Services to the residents of Orange County; and

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT is desirous of contracting with DISTRICT, subject to the approval of the County Administrator, hereinafter referred to as "ADMINISTRATOR", for the provision of Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports and Violence Prevention Education Services in order to comply with the Agreement with COUNTY to provide Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS) to the residents of Orange County; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is specially trained, experienced and competent to perform the services required, and is agreeable to the

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rendering of such services according to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- The term of this Agreement shall commence on March TERM. 31, 2010 and terminate no later than March 31, 2010, subject to termination as set forth in this Agreement, provided, however, DISTRICT shall be obligated to perform such duties as would normally extend beyond this term including, but not limited to, obligations with respect to indemnification, audits, reporting, and accounting. This Agreement shall be void unless approved by ADMINISTRATOR.
- SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED. 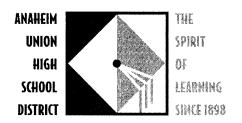
## AUHSD School Improvement Grant (SIG) Program Application for Funding

On the motion of Mr. Brandman, duly seconded and unanimously carried, following discussion, the Board of Trustees approved the AUHSD School Improvement Grant (SIG) Program application for funding. The one-time funding is intended to improve student achievement, must supplement and not supplant, and can be used for salaries, training, instructional materials, and facilities. Only schools currently participating in the Quality in Education Investment Act (QEIA), and also designated as Program Improvement, Corrective Action, or Alternative Governance are eligible to apply for the SIG Program. South and Sycamore Junior High Schools are eligible, and each school may apply for \$50,000 to \$500,000. The application is due to the California Department of Education by April 15, 2010. However, there is not enough SIG funding available for all eligible schools, so priority will be given to each district based on the date and time the district's application is received. The funding for each school must be expended by September 30, 2010. (SIG Funds)

## 4.2 Medi-Cal Documentation/Paradigm Clarification

Only bill "Classroom" if you are consulting with the whole class. If you go in the classroom and work with a specific group of students, bill this as "Group". Don't consider the setting, i.e. classroom, therapy room. You are really billing "individual" or "group." We do not get reimbursed for "Classroom" or "Consult". You may now bill for an "amended" evaluation every 30 days.

We have talked to Paradigm about easing the billing method. Celeste will speak with Mary more about this when Mary meets with the SYS staff on Monday, April 26, 2010.
