ACTION ITEM

12.2 Purchase of Modular Buildings, Utilizing Piggyback Bid

ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to authorize Tim Holcomb, deputy superintendent, to purchase DSA-Approved Relocatable Buildings. At the May 13, 2010, meeting, the board approved a list of necessary facilities projects. One of the projects is the relocation of district-owned portable buildings to Western and Savanna high schools. Part of the plan calls for additional restroom facilities. It is anticipated that two new restroom buildings will be needed, at a cost not to exceed \$450,000, under the terms and conditions of the piggyback bid awarded by the San Gabriel Unified School District, Bid #16-04/05. The acquisition of these relocatable buildings will be from Silver Creek Industries, Inc., pursuant to the piggyback bid provisions of Public Contract Code Section 20118. It is in the best interest of the district to acquire these buildings through the San Gabriel Unified School District. (Developer Fees) **[EXHIBIT B]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees authorize the purchase.

13.1 Educational Consulting Agreements

13.1.1 Kagan Professional Development

Approve the educational consulting agreement with Kagan Professional Development, which will conduct a one-day workshop for the Collaborating for Excellence in Middle School Science (CEMSS) grant teachers entitled, Kagan Structures for Cooperative Learning and Active Engagement. This workshop will provide the CEMSS teachers with engaging, hands-on cooperative learning strategies utilizing 7th and 8th grade science concepts and standards. Teachers will be able to immediately implement these strategies in their classrooms. The 90 science teachers will also receive a Cooperative Learning book and binder illustrating the cooperative learning strategies. The workshop will be hosted at Chapman University on November 16, 2010, at a cost of \$5,000, plus \$31 per person for materials, for a total cost not to exceed \$7,800. (CaMSP/CEMSS Grant Funds) **[EXHIBIT C]**

13.1.2 San Diego County Superintendent of Schools

Approve the educational consulting agreement with San Diego County Superintendent of Schools' WRITE Institute for secondary English Language Development (ELD) and Spanish for Spanish Speakers' teachers. WRITE Institute will provide trainer-of-trainers' training, data collection support, and training materials as part of an annual training cycle. This annual training cycle consists of one full day of training for district trainers, followed by three additional unit trainings calendared throughout the school year. District trainers will train and coach up to 42 additional participating ELD and Spanish teachers in Tier 1 and Tier 2 of WRITE's secondary ELD program, or the Spanish for Spanish Speakers program. This will result in more effective classroom implementation of curriculum and assessment, targeting optimum teacher effectiveness, student achievement, and systemic educational improvement as a component of AUHSD's ELD/English Language Arts/primary-language literacy model. Services will be provided August 27, 2010, through June 30, 2011, at a cost not to exceed \$4,200. (Title III Funds) [EXHIBIT D]

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the educational consulting agreements.

13.2.1 UC College Prep

[EXHIBIT E]

Approve the course license agreement between The Regents of the University of California, University of California College Prep (UCCP) program, and the district, August 26, 2010, through June 30, 2013. This licensing agreement provides the district teachers and students free access to UC-developed courses for interactive online advanced placement and college preparatory courses. These high-quality interactive online courses will supplement the eLearning curriculum in the content areas of social sciences, health, and mathematics. The district agrees to annually report to the University of California the aggregated student usage data of the UCCP courses for the term of this agreement. This agreement is at no cost to the district.

13.2.2 Special Services, Demsey, Filliger and Associates, LLC

Approve the special services agreement with Demsey, Filliger and Associates, LLC to provide an actuarial valuation, which complies with the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) 45 regulations. Government Code Section 53060 authorizes public agencies to contract with specially trained, experienced, and competent persons for professional services. In order to comply with GASB 45 regulations regarding retirement benefit liabilities, specialized actuarial services are needed to prepare a valuation of the district's retiree health insurance program. The actuarial valuation will update a July 1, 2008, study prepared by Demsey, Filliger and Associates, LLC, at a cost not to exceed \$5,500. (Health and Welfare Funds)

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the agreements.

13.3 Agreement Amendment, Budlong and Associates, Inc.

Approve an amendment to an existing agreement with Budlong and Associates, Inc. A number of the projects included in the Essential Facility Projects list, which was approved by the Board of Trustees at its May 13, 2010, meeting, requires engineering design services. The amendment to the agreement, in the amount of \$150,000, will increase the contract to a total cost not to exceed \$350,000. (Maintenance Funds, Facilities Funds, and/or other funds as appropriate) **[EXHIBIT G]**

13.4 Memorandum of Understanding, Fullerton Joint Union High School District

Approve the memorandum of understanding between the district and the Fullerton Joint Union High School District (FJUHSD) to provide special education services to their students. Special Education Local Plan Areas (SELPAs) have provisions that allow districts to service students from/to other districts within highly specialized programs. In this instance, a student from FJUHSD will enter the district's program for visually impaired students. This agreement also provides for the SELPA to pay the provider district, AUHSD, for the cost of services required for this student. Services will be provided August 30, 2010, through June 30, 2011. (SELPA Funds) **[EXHIBIT H]**

- 11. The following is a brief description of what will be achieved by Consultant as a result of this AGREEMENT:

San Diego County Superintendent of Schools' WRITE Institute will train three lead trainers who, in turn, will train and coach up to 42 ELD and Spanish for Spanish Speakers teachers, to implement WRITE units in the updated courses being offered during the 2010-11 school year at 14 AUHSD schools. The purpose of expanding Spanish for Spanish Speakers is to support English Language Development as well as sophisticated, academic Spanish language competency, moving native-Spanish speakers towards passage of AP Spanish Language and AP Spanish Literature examinations. In 2009-10, the program was highly successful and well received, resulting in the need for teachers to be trained and coached for further success in 2010-11. Currently, the Spanish Language Arts component of WRITE Institute's Biliteracy model is training teachers across the state, via professional development, hosted by the Los Angeles, San Diego and San Joaquin County Offices of Education. AUHSD will have the capacity to sustain the training without sending participating teachers to the county offices.

12. What are the technical reasons Consultant is being hired as an Independent Contractor rather than an employee?

The lead trainers of WRITE Institute are employees of the San Diego County Office of Education, and are not available to be hired directly by the district. The purpose of the training model is to train AUHSD staff, who will then train AUSHD teachers.

Since the training for the lead trainers will be held offsite, only e-mail and internet access to WRITE sites will be required. No technical support will be required. For training implementation within the district, only the usual presentation-related technology (laptop, LCD projector) will be required.

COURSE LICENSE AGREEMENT

This Course License Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into on the date of August 26, 2010 (the "Effective Date") by and between The Regents of the University of California ("University"), on behalf of its Santa Cruz campus and the University of California College Prep program ("UC College Prep" or "UCCP"), and the educational organization Anaheim Union High School District ("Licensee").

Recitals

WHEREAS, University has received state funding to develop online courses and programs aimed at increasing the eligibility of California students for admission to the University of California and other colleges and universities;

WHEREAS, University has developed high quality interactive online Advanced Placement® and college preparatory courses and provides free online access to courses, content and materials for California students and teachers to use:

WHEREAS, Licensee offers online courses and content to students within its educational organization, school district or school to increase academic performance and college eligibility; and

WHEREAS, University and Licensee desire to upload and adapt UC College Prep courses for Licensee to instruct its students, provide academic resources to teachers, or to provide college prep options to underserved schools.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

Definitions

- I. "UC College Prep Course" means courses as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto.
- II. "Licensed Course" means a UCCP Course with assessments uploaded and adapted for use on Licensee's CMS.
- III. "Content" means information, including data, documentation, text, audio, video, graphics, animation, drawings, programming, icons, images, pictures and charts.
- IV. "Licensee-Created Content" means Content Licensee's own Teachers add to the Licensed Course.

- V. "CMS" means the course management system or learning management system that allows Content to be stored and managed so that Teachers and Students can take advantage of various course management tools (grade book, calendars, announcements, etc.), communications tools (forums, whiteboards, etc.), and course progress tracking capabilities.
- VI. "Participating School" means a school or program within the Licensee's jurisdiction that is authorized by Licensee to access UC College Prep Courses pursuant to this Agreement.
- VII. "Student" means a Student enrolled in a Licensed Course pursuant to this Agreement.
- VIII. "Teacher" means a teacher, counselor, administrator, or other educator to whom the Licensee grants access to UC College Prep Courses and/or providing services in association with a licensed Course pursuant to this Agreement.
- IX. "UC Online Policy" means the official policy established by UC Admissions for the use of online courses (www.ucop.edu/a-gGuide/ag/).

Terms

- 1. **Term**. The term of this Agreement shall be from Effective Date through to June 30, 2013 (the "Term"). Thereafter, provided that neither party is in material breach of a material term, this Agreement shall be subject to renegotiation, unless notice of non-renewal has been provided by one party to the other party thirty (30) days prior to the end of the then current term. In the event of renegotiation, the parties shall make reasonable best efforts to reach mutual agreement on any reasonable changes in terms. If, despite best efforts, either party determines that mutual agreement is not feasible, that party shall inform the other party in writing, whereupon any and all obligation to renegotiate shall cease.
- 2. **Grant of rights**. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, University hereby grants to Licensee, its Students and Teachers, and Licensee accepts a non-exclusive, royalty-free, terminable (to the extent set forth herein), non-transferable license, for the Term, to copy, display and distribute content for the sole purpose of:
 - 2.1. Uploading royalty-free UC College Prep Courses into the Licensee's CMS;
 - 2.2. Providing access to courses through a Participating School for use by Teachers and Students in California;
 - 2.3. University also grants to Licensee the right to create, copy and distribute derivative works based on Content by preparing Licensee-Created Content. University will own any Licensee-Created Content. University also hereby grants Licensee a non-exclusive, royalty-free, license to the Licensee-Created Content. The Licensee represents and warrants to the extent of the actual knowledge of Licensee:
 - 2.3.1. That the Licensee is the sole and exclusive creator of the material it has added to the derivative works except for copyrighted material in which the Licensee has gained written permission to use from the owner.

- 2.3.2. That the material it has added to the derivative works is original; the Licensee has the full right and authority to enter into this Agreement and grant the rights granted herein to the University and the Licensee has not previously assigned, transferred or otherwise encumbered such rights.
- 2.3.3. That to the best of Licensee's knowledge the derivative works do not infringe upon any statutory or common law copyright or violate any law or government regulation, will contain no matter which will be libelous or otherwise injurious in violation of any right of privacy or any other personal or proprietary right of any third party; will contain no material which to the best of the Licensee' knowledge and belief is inaccurate, or any statement, instruction, material, or formula that involves the foreseeable risk of injury to readers or users of the derivative works.
- 2.3.4. Should any derivative works be used in conjunction of University provided course material, which in the opinion of the University may result in a breach of the foregoing warranties, the University shall have the right to withhold any and all rights given to Licensee under this agreement, upon which Licensee having received written notice from the University shall remove all University course material from Licensee online offerings. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to impose upon the University any duty of independent investigation, nor shall any independent investigation by the University relieve the Licensee of the Licensee' obligations hereunder.
- 2.4. No other rights are granted under this license.
- 3. **Reservation of Rights**. UC College Prep specifically reserves the right to exercise its copyright rights in UC College Prep Courses, together with any modifications or derivative works thereof created by UC College Prep or on behalf of UC College Prep in any manner that UC College Prep deems appropriate.
- 4. **Sublicensing**. Sublicensing of UC College Prep Courses or Licensed Courses by Licensee is expressly prohibited.
- 5. **Reports**. Licensee shall provide basic data on usage of UC College Prep Courses and Licensed Courses and student information to UC College Prep as identified in Exhibit C, and subject to the conditions set forth in Exhibit C.

6. UC College Prep Course Conversion.

- 6.1. Cost. The University and Licensee agree that Licensee will be solely responsible for uploading, converting and revising UC College Prep Courses into Licensee's CMS at its expense.
 - 6.1.1. File Transfer. University will deliver all content files related to the UC College Prep Courses "as is" (including data, documentation, text, audio, video, drawings, programming, meta-tags, links, icons, images, pictures, charts, and any and all materials intended for use by a student, including without limitation, all learning activities, instructions for completing the same, answer keys, and supplementary or reference materials provided for use by teachers) to Licensee via FTP site or distributors. The content files or course shells shall be used for the sole purpose of converting and uploading the UC College Prep Courses into the Licensee's CMS.
- 6.2. Conversion to Licensee CMS. Certain revisions in both activity type and format may be required to convert the UC College Prep Courses into courses that may be delivered through the Licensee's CMS. Licensee shall convert and upload the UC College Prep Courses to the Licensee CMS at its expense.
- 6.3. Shared Converted Courses. In order to make UC College Prep Courses available to other partners in various CMS formats, University may request Licensee and Licensee will provide copies of converted UC College Prep courses in the CMS format used by Licensee.
- 6.4. Course Revisions. Certain revisions in both text and instructional design may be required to convert and upload the courses to the Licensee's CMS. The parties agree that Licensee shall oversee and perform all the changes required to convert the UC College Prep Courses into the Licensed Courses at its expense.
- 6.5. Content Accuracy. UC College Prep is providing the UCCP Courses "as is." The parties acknowledge that should any Content corrections be necessary, Licensee will use reasonable efforts to notify UC College Prep of the errors prior to or at the time of their correction, but Licensee will be responsible for fixing those errors at its expense.

7. Licensee's Obligations.

7.1. Equipment. Licensee's Participating Schools, Teachers and Students will be responsible for all the necessary computer hardware, software, modems, connections to the Internet and other items that are needed for accessing the Licensed Courses, and all costs associated with such access. Technical requirements for running UC College Prep Courses are identified in Exhibit D.

- 7.2. Deployment of UC College Prep Courses. Licensee must deploy and deliver UCCP Courses in compliance with current <u>UC Online Policy</u> for courses to be accepted by University admissions. UC College Prep courses must be delivered in the sequence identified in its syllabus, which is provided with each UCCP Course, to be considered approved courses.
- 7.3. Outreach to Underserved Schools. Licensee shall seek to make UC College Prep Courses available to underserved schools within its jurisdiction.
- 7.4. Compliance with Laws. The University, UC College Prep and Licensee shall comply with all federal and state laws applicable to the parties' performance of this Agreement, including without limitation those regarding student records and personal information of Licensee students and employees, privacy, commercial use of student and employee information and other similar laws, administrative rules and regulations. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the University, UC College Prep and Licensee shall comply with FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) and where applicable, the Child Internet Protection ACT (CIPA).

8. UC College Prep's Obligations.

- 8.1. New Course Versions and Corrections. University will post new versions of UC College Prep Courses and revised or corrected versions of UC College Prep Courses in Moodle shells and HTML format on or before June of each year for download and use by Licensee.
- 8.2. New or Revised Syllabi. Updated College Board-approved syllabi will be provided on a UC College Prep secure FTP site for download by Licensee in June of each year.
- 8.3. Format for Reporting Student Data. File formats will be provided to Licensee in June-July of each year for use in categorizing and submitting Student data to UC College Prep (Exhibit C).

9. Intellectual Property.

- 9.1. Title. The parties agree that the UC College Prep Courses, and any derivative works created, are, and shall at all times remain, the property of University. Licensee shall have no right, title or interest therein or thereto except as expressly set forth in this Agreement.
- 9.2. Copyright Notice. The parties will identify the Licensed Courses as (i) originally created by University of California College Prep and (ii) copyright is held by The Regents of the University of California, pursuant to the copyright notices provided by University in Exhibit B, attached hereto.

10. Representations and Warranties.

- 10.1. Authority. Each party hereby represents and warrants to the other that, to the best of its knowledge as of the Effective Date, (a) it has the full right, power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement and to grant the rights herein, (b) it is an organization duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of its state of organization, and (c) this Agreement has been duly authorized, executed and delivered and constitutes the valid and binding obligation of such party enforceable in accordance with its terms.
- 10.2. Warranty of Title. To the best of its knowledge as of the Effective Date, UC College Prep represents and warrants to Licensee that University holds all rights necessary to use the UC College Prep Courses and grant each of the licenses described herein.
- 10.3. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY SET FORTH IN THIS AGREEMENT,
 UNIVERSITY AND LICENSEE MAKE NO REPRESENTATIONS AND
 EXTENDS NO WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND, EITHER EXPRESS OR
 IMPLIED, INCLUDING THE WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY
 AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR THAT USE OF THE
 LICENSED MATERIALS WILL NOT INFRINGE ANY PATENT,
 COPYRIGHT, OR OTHER INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OF A THIRD
 PARTY. NOTHING IN THIS AGREEMENT CONFERS BY IMPLICATION,
 ESTOPPEL OR OTHERWISE ANY RIGHTS IN UNIVERSITY'S OR
 LICENSEE'S INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY SET
 FORTH THEREIN.

11. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY.

11.1. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED HEREIN, AND IN SECTION 12 OF THIS AGREEMENT, NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR ANY INDIRECT, SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF OR IN ANY WAY CONNECTED WITH THIS AGREEMENT OR THE USE OR PERFORMANCE OF THE LICENSED MATERIALS, EVEN IF ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY THEREOF.

12. Indemnification.

- 12.1. Licensee shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless University, its officers, agents and employees from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, and damages arising out of Licensee's performance of this Agreement, but only in proportion to and to the extent that such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, costs and damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Licensee, its officers, agents, or employees.
- 12.2. University shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Licensee, its Board of Education, officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all

liability, loss, expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, and damages arising out of University's performance under this Agreement, but only in proportion to and to the extent that such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, costs and damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of University, its officers, agents, or employees.

13. Default and Termination.

- 13.1. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time for any or no reason by giving the other thirty (30) days' prior written notice.
- 13.2. If Licensee fails to make reasonable efforts to provide student data (as required in paragraph 5 to University within thirty (30) days after written notice that the same is overdue and reportable, or if Licensee fails to observe, keep, or perform any other material provision of this Agreement, and having been notified by University thereof, has failed to cure, or to diligently commence to cure, such failure within thirty (30) days thereof, University shall have the right to terminate this Agreement and the license granted herein.
- 13.3. In the event of termination of this Agreement, Licensee shall cease to exercise all rights to the UC College Prep Courses and materials and shall return or destroy all copies of the UC College Prep Courses; provided, however, any Student then enrolled in a UC College Prep Course or Licensed Course shall be permitted to complete such UC College Prep Course or Licensed Course notwithstanding any termination of this Agreement by University. Licensee will provide University with written notice, signed by an officer of the school Licensee, describing the procedures undertaken to comply with the requirements of this Article.

14. Notices.

14.1. Any notice required to be given to either party shall be deemed to have been given and to be effective (a) on the date of delivery, if delivered in person; or (b) five (5) days after mailing, if mailed by first-class certified mail, postage paid, to the respective addresses given below, or to such other address as it shall designate by written notice to the other party.

SPECIAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is effective August 26, 2010, and it is made by and between Demsey, Filliger & Associates, LLC, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR," and the Anaheim Union High School District, hereinafter referred to as "District." DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR shall be collectively referred to as the Parties.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advise in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of special services and advice in business, financial, economic, accounting, engineering, or administrative matters; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained, experienced, and competent to provide the special services and reports required.

NOW, **THEREFORE**, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Scope of Work. CONTRACTOR shall provide a GASB 45 actuarial valuation report as of July 1, 2010. The report will be an update of the actuarial valuation report that CONTRACTOR prepared for the District as of July 1, 2008. The scope of services will be in accordance with the CONTRACTOR's proposed scope of service and fees dated July 27, 2010. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement. CONTRACTOR'S services are to be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principals and practices of his/her profession.

The DISTRICT will prepare and furnish to the CONTRACTOR upon request such information as is reasonably necessary to the performance of the CONTRACTOR to this Agreement.

2. Term. CONTRACTOR will commence providing services under this Agreement upon notification of Board approval, and will diligently perform as required and complete said performance within 6 calendar weeks following receipt of all requested data from the DISTRICT, subject to termination as set forth in this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall be obligated to perform such duties as would normally extend beyond this term including, but not limited to, obligations with respect to indemnification, audits, reporting, and accounting.

- 3. Compensation. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to Section 1 of this Agreement a total fee of exactly five thousand five hundred dollars (\$5,500). DISTRICT shall pay this total fee to the CONTRACTOR within thirty (30) days of the DISTRICT's receipt of a draft actuarial report and invoice from CONTRACTOR. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT. DISTRICT may withhold or delay any payment should CONTRACTOR fail to comply with any of the provisions set forth in this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall have the reasonable expectation of receiving all requested data from the DISTRICT that CONTRACTOR requires in order to perform services hereunder.
- 4. Independent Contractor. CONTRACTOR, in performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this Agreement. CONTRACTOR assumes full responsibility for payment of all federal, state, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR'S employees.
- 5. <u>Duty to Provide Fit Workers</u>. CONTRACTOR shall at all times enforce strict discipline and good order among its employees and shall not employ on work any unfit person or anyone not skilled in work assigned to such person. It shall be the responsibility of CONTRACTOR to ensure compliance with this section. Any person in the employ of the CONTRACTOR whom DISTRICT may deem incompetent, unfit intemperate, troublesome or otherwise undesirable shall be excluded from the work site and shall not again be employed onsite without written consent of DISTRICT.
- 6. <u>Copyright</u>. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT'S express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title, and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT.
- 7. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and shall hold harmless and indemnify the DISTRICT, its Governing Board, and its officers, agents, and employees from every claim or demand made and every liability or loss, damage, or expense of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
 - (a) Liability for damages for death or bodily injury to person, injury to property, or any other loss, damage or expense sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any

person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR upon or in connection with the services called for in this agreement except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT, its Governing Board, and its officers, employees, or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of persons or damage to property, sustained by any persons, firm, or corporation, including the DISTRICT, arising out of, or in any way connected with the services covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off school district property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT, its officers, employees, or agents.

The CONTRACTOR, at CONTRACTOR'S expense, cost and risk, shall defend any and all actions, suits, or other proceeding that may be brought or instituted against the DISTRICT, its Governing Board, and its officers, agents, or employees on any such claim, demand, or liability and shall pay or satisfy any judgment that may be rendered against the DISTRICT, its Governing Board, and its officers, agents, or employees in any action, suit, or other proceedings as a result thereof.

- 8. Records. CONTRACTOR shall prepare and maintain accurate and complete financial records of its costs as they relate to the services provided by this Agreement. Financial records shall be retained for at least four (4) years from the date of final payment or until audit findings are resolved, whichever is longer. CONTRACTOR will maintain the confidentiality of all records, including billings, in accordance with all applicable County, State, and Federal statutes and regulations. CONTRACTOR shall inform all its officers, employees, and agents of their responsibility for maintaining the confidentiality provisions of this section.
- 9. <u>Inspection and Audit</u>. DISTRICT shall have access for the purpose of auditing or examining any records of CONTRACTOR pertinent to this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall maintain records of services provided and financial records for a period of four (4) years, unless such period is waived by DISTRICT.
- 10. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by the DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- 11. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR.

- 12. Compliance with Applicable Laws. The services completed herein must meet approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT'S general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable CONTRACTOR'S business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such services.
- 13. <u>Employment with Public Agency</u>. CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, certifies that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 14. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sect of such persons. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to employ persons solely on the basis of merit without regard to race, religion, color, gender, national origin, sexual preference, medical condition, marital status, ancestry, age or physical or mental handicap.
- 15. <u>Tobacco Use Policy</u>. In the interest of public health, DISTRICT provides a tobacco-free environment. Smoking or the use of any tobacco products are prohibited in buildings and vehicles, and on any property owned, leased or contracted for by the DISTRICT. Failure to abide with conditions of this policy could result in the termination of this Agreement.
- 16. Notice. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.
- 18. <u>Severability</u>. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.
- 19. Attorney Fees/Costs. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorney's fees.
- 20. <u>Governing Law</u>. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California.
- 21. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement.

WHEREAS, the scope of services under the Agreement have expanded due to additional Projects;

MEMORANDUM of UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN ANAHIEM UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT AND FULLERTON JOINT HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Education Code sections 56195 et seq. authorize school districts to provide special education services to students in other districts by organizing Special Education Local Plan Areas (SELPAs) and by developing local plans;

WHEREAS, these statutory provisions authorize school districts to provide for a governing structure and any necessary administrative support to implement the local plans, including a system for determining the responsibility of participating agencies for the education of each special education student;

WHEREAS, Education Code section 56195.5 authorizes districts and SELPAs to enter into contracts between school districts to provide for the education of special education students who may reside in other districts;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by and between the Anaheim Union High School District (hereinafter referred to as the "Provider District") and the Fullerton Joint Union School District (hereinafter referred to as the "Sending District") as follows:

1. Basis of Agreement

Pursuant to the authority established in Education Code sections 56195, 56195.1, 56195.3 and 56195.5, the Provider District may provide for the education of individual pupils in special education programs who reside in other districts or counties. Education Code section 46600 shall apply to interdistrict attendance agreements for programs conducted pursuant to this part.

2. Term of Agreement

This Agreement is effective for the period beginning August 30, 2010 through June 30, 2011.

3. Acknowledgment

It is acknowledged that, in accordance with Part 30 of the Education Code, Chapter 7.2, the California State funding formula for special education programs, services and administration generates an entitlement based on the average daily attendance of pupils in the local education agencies that comprise a SELPA.

4. Scope

The Provider shall conduct special education program and services for those eligible pupils of the Sending District referred by their Individual Education Program (IEP) Teams when it is jointly determined by the Sending District and the Provider District that the pupils' educational needs as specified in the IEP can be appropriately met by the programs operated by the Provider District. The Provider District shall maintain and provide special education programs for Sending District pupils during the 2010 and 2011 school years within the administrative parameters established by the Provider District's SELPA. Class size ranges and student-adult ratios shall be maintained in a manner which allows the Provider District to meet the programmatic, health and safety needs of the pupils.

5. Annual and Triennial Reviews

The Sending District shall be notified of annual reviews and may provide a representative who will participate in the development of the IEP. For initial placement, triennial review, or a change in services specified on the current IEP, a Sending District representative who is authorized to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified Sending District resources necessary for the implementation of the IEP shall attend the IEP Meeting.

6. Pupil Count

A count shall be taken of the number of pupils enrolled in the programs as of the first day of each calendar month, August through June. A pupil shall be counted as "enrolled" on the first day of attendance in the program or fourteen (14) days after the IEP Team has met and an approved IEP has been executed for the educational placement in the Special Schools Program, whichever occurs sooner. Pupils continuing in the programs from the previous school year shall be counted as "enrolled" on the first school day in September unless written notification of withdrawal is received from either the parent or Sending District. If a continuing pupil has not attended school by the eleventh day of the first school month, the Provider District shall notify the Sending District and a determination shall be made regarding continuing enrollment.

7. Definitions

- a. "District Provided Programs" are the special education classes and support services operated by Provider District on behalf of SELPAs and districts in Orange County for special education students residing in their SELPA and district.
- b. "Special Education Program Income" shall be defined as the sum of all State and Federal funds generated by or on behalf of pupils transferred to programs operated by the Provider District under this Agreement.
- c. "Special Education Program Expenditures" shall include Direct Costs, Direct Support Costs and Indirect Cost of Special Schools Programs.

- d. "Average Cost Per Pupil" shall refer to the Special Education Program Expenditures attributable to the program divided by the average number of pupils enrolled during the year.
- e. "Average Number of Pupils" shall refer to the total of the number of pupils counted on the first school day of each calendar month divided by the number of calendar months in the period specified.

8. Funding

In consideration of the enrollment of pupils in special education programs conducted by the Provider District, the SELPA and/or the Sending District transferring pupils to the programs operated by the Provider District agree to pay the Provider District the cost of services based on the schedule attached hereto as Exhibit A.

9. Transportation

The Sending District transporting pupils to the Provider District shall ensure that buses arrive at the school site with sufficient time to unload students prior to the beginning of the instructional day and to load them at the end of the instructional day. Delays requiring either overtime supervision or causing portions of the instructional program to be missed and subsequently made up may result in charges to the Sending District for additional costs incurred by the Provider District.

10. Final Accounting

A final accounting accompanied by completed forms and invoices with appropriate supporting documentation will be sent by the Provider District to Sending District by October 15 of the following year. Corrections to prior year Special Education Program costs resulting from adjustments to income or expenditure calculations shall be credited or billed to the Sending District affected by the correction or adjustments.

11. Projected Enrollment

In order to assist the Provider District in planning for both housing and staffing needs for the programs, Sending District shall submit to the Provider District, in writing, on or before February 15 of each year, the projected number of pupils expected to be transferred to the programs for special education and support services in the following school year. Absent a projection, the number of Sending District pupils reported in the current year December 1 Federal Pupil Count shall be used for staffing and budget planning for the following school year.

12. Program Cost

On or before fifteen days after the release of the May revise each year, the Provider District shall compute the projected Special Education Program Income and Special Education Program Expenditures for the following year with an Average Cost per Pupil for pupils enrolled in Special Schools Programs based on the Projected Enrollment data, and provide it to Sending District's Special Education Department and Business Services Department.

13. No Waiver

The failure of the Provider District in any one or more instances to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms of this Agreement or to exercise any option herein conferred shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment to any extent of the right to assert or rely upon such terms or option on any future occasion.

14. Hold Harmless

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the acts or omissions or employees, agents and officers of the Sending District, the Provider District hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend the Sending District and its officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising from or connected with the Provider District's performance of services during the term of this Agreement.

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the acts or omissions of employees, agents and officers of Provider District, the Sending District hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend Provider District and its governing board and their officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising directly or indirectly from or connected with the performance of services other than for operations of Provider District during the term of this Agreement.

15. Complete Agreement

This Agreement is the complete Agreement of the parties. Any amendments hereto shall be in writing and shall be dated and executed by both parties.

Services will be provided July 1, 2010, through June 30, 2011, at a cost not to exceed \$14,880. (General Funds and/or other funds as appropriate)

10.4 Agreement, California School Management Consulting, Inc.

On the motion of Mrs. Piercy, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the Board of Trustees approved the professional services agreement with California School Management (CSM) Consulting, Inc. for E-Rate consulting services. The Information Systems Department utilizes E-Rate consultants to provide assistance including, but not limited to, E-Rate form filing, process, guidance, audit documentation, telecommunication services review, and fund collection. The agreement brings highly specialized and unique expertise to the district and it is considered crucial to the E-Rate funding. The district traditionally receives \$250,000 to \$500,000 annually for E-Rate Priority I services, which include: phone, cellular phone, and data service. Moreover, the district has received almost \$6,000,000 for E-Rate Priority II services for network infrastructure including switching, cabling, and system servers. Services will be provided July 1, 2010, through June 30, 2011, at a cost not to exceed \$27,600. (General Funds)

10.5 Educational Consulting Agreements

On the motion of Mr. Brandman, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the Board of Trustees approved the educational consulting agreements, as listed, for the Anaheim Union High School District (AUHSD) 2010 Associated Student Body (ASB) Retreat. This retreat has been in existence for the past 16 years. The AUHSD ASB Retreat was created to provide high quality and district-specific leadership training to students not available through other organizations. All AUHSD ASB Retreat fees are paid through ASB fundraisers, the funds of which are controlled by student leaders. The fees vary significantly because of the differences in services and the experience of the various consultants. The retreat takes place in San Diego, California, to provide ASB leaders with the opportunity to focus on developing leadership skills over a three-day period. The dates of the event are August 9, 2010, through August 11, 2010.

ASB officers will be trained to use strategies to improve their effectiveness in the student governance process. ASB officers will also learn strategies to increase overall student participation in school-wide student body

activities. Services will be provided August 10, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$250. (ASB Funds)

10.5.2 Feet First/David Cloutier

Feet First/David Cloutier, consultant, will present age-appropriate ideas for school dances, provide disc jockey services for the retreat's dances, and conduct workshop sessions that focus on team-building activities. Services will be provided August 9, 2010, through August 11, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$3,500. (ASB Funds)

Jeremy Hersch, consultant, will present a series of leadership workshops to teach student leaders how to plan successful high school events using technological strategies for the 21st century. Services will be provided August 10, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$250. (ASB Funds)

10.5.5 Rhett Laubauch/Your Next Speaker, LLC

Rhett Laubauch/Your Next Speaker, LLC, consultant, will be a keynote speaker and breakout session presenter. Mr. Laubauch is a nationally recognized motivational speaker, for professional, civic, and educational organizations. He inspires and motivates with his knowledge, enthusiasm, and expertise on positive leadership traits. He motivates audiences to persevere, prevail, and succeed despite adversity. Services will be provided August 10, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$2,000. (ASB Funds)

10.5.6 Matthew McKinney

Matthew McKinney, consultant, will be the balloon-art workshop presenter to train ASB students in the fundamentals of balloon art. Students will use these skills to build balloon arches for special events, such as assemblies and athletic events. Services will be provided August 10, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$375. (ASB Funds)

10.5.7 Janet Roberts

Janet Roberts, consultant, will provide workshops to train ASB students on poster making, advertisement, publicity, and marketing techniques designed to increase student body participation in all ASB activities. Services will be provided August 10, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$100. (ASB Funds)

10.5.8 Stuart R. Shaffer

Stuart R. Shaffer, consultant, will be the school spirit activity presenter. Mr. Shaffer's presentation includes ideas for skits, noon-time activities, and spirit week activities.

Services will be provided August 10, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$1,150. (ASB Funds)

10.6 Terms of Service, Institutional Contract, Haiku Learning Systems, Inc.

On the motion of Mr. Brandman, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the Board of Trustees approved the Terms of Service, Institutional Contract with Haiku Learning Systems, Inc. for the purchase of user subscriptions for the Haiku Learning Management System. Haiku is the platform used by virtual teachers in online learning programs. It allows teachers to design curriculum, conduct threaded discussions, manage and collect student work, conduct virtual one-on-one lessons, provide access to real-time data, and provide students with performance feedback. The current learning management system contract with Angel Learning, currently hosted by the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE), expires on June 30, 2010, and it will not be renewed by the OCDE. Haiku Learning Systems, Inc. will work directly with the AUHSD eLearning virtual teachers, the new outreach teachers, and the Information Systems Department. The agreement is for 1,500 user subscriptions at \$3.80 per user, plus set-up fees. It also includes all existing and future tools and resources, as well as on-going technical support. Services will be provided June 21, 2010, through June 30, 2013, at a cost not to exceed \$6,000 per year. (Title II, Part D, and Carl C. Perkins Funds)

10.7 <u>No Child Left Behind, Title I, Part A: Program Improvement Alternative</u> Governance Plan for Dale Junior High School

On the motion of Mr. Holguin, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the Board of Trustees approved the No Child Left Behind (NCLB), Title I, Part A: Program Improvement (PI) Alternative Governance Plan for Dale Junior High School. The Alternative Governance Plan requires an extensive self-review process, which must be undertaken by schools in the fourth year of PI. During 2009-10, Dale Junior High School conducted an extensive self-review process, in which the staff was required to consider the following restructuring options per NCLB federal guidance:

- 1. Close the school and reopen it as a charter school.
- 2. Replace all or most of the school staff.
- 3. Enter into a contract with an entity, such as a private management company with a demonstrated record of effectiveness, to operate the public school.
- 4. Turn the operation of the school over to the state (not an option in California).
- 5. Implement any other major restructuring of the school's governance arrangement that makes fundamental reforms and leads to improved student achievement.

Dale staff explored available restructuring options and used Dale's existing Corrective Action Plan as the framework to develop a restructuring plan to be implemented in 2010-11. The process included a strategic analysis of curriculum, instruction, intervention strategies, and school climate issues to determine the causes of failure to meet Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) goals, for six consecutive years. (Schools are identified as PI after failing to make AYP goals for two years.) Option five, the most plausible restructuring option, was selected, "Implement any other major restructuring of the school's governance arrangement that makes fundamental reforms and leads to improved student achievement."

Gayle Carpenter, interim principal, presented the Dale Junior High School Alternative Governance Plan to district principals on May 12, 2010, at a principals' meeting. The presentation detailed aspects of the school's failure to make AYP goals, including socioemotional and pedagogical findings. At the May 12, 2010, meeting, principals peer reviewed and approved the plan.

Dale Junior High School will implement the Alternative Governance Plan in 2010-11. Actions detailed in the plan include: refining intra-departmental curriculum alignment, proper identification and placement of students, appropriate academic and socio-emotional interventions, a bell schedule with an advisory/intervention period, the implementation of research-proven instructional strategies, and continual monitoring of student progress. (Title I Funds)

10.8 District Corrective Action Plan, Instructional Analyst

On the motion of Mr. Brandman, duly seconded and unanimously carried, following discussion, the Board of Trustees approved the newly designed position of Instructional Analyst as part of the district's mandated Corrective Action Plan. After two years of not meeting No Child Left Behind Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) targets, the district is entering into the corrective action phase of Program Improvement. In this phase, the district is required to develop a plan of action to address the academic needs of students. The position of Instructional Analyst has been created to assist schools in using data to design effective instructional action plans in response to identified student needs. This individual will train teachers and administrators to analyze, with greater accuracy, site and district level data enabling sites to modify curriculum and instruction with the ultimate goal of improving student outcomes. This includes interpretation of data, reflection on instructional practice and programs, development of planned actions to improve student learning, and monitoring implementation of planned actions. The Instructional Analyst will perform other related work as required under the direction of the coordinator of testing and evaluation. (Title I Funds)

11. CONSENT CALENDAR

On the motion of Mr. Brandman, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the Board of Trustees approved/ratified items listed under the consent calendar with the exception of item 11.7, pulled by Mrs. Piercy for discussion.

11.1 Instructional Materials Submitted for Display

The Board of Trustees approved the selected materials for display, recommended by the Instructional Materials Review Committee, for basic and elective courses in Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID). Before the materials can be approved for adoption, the materials must be made available for public review. The Board of Trustees will be requested to consider adoption of the materials following the end of the period of public display, June 3, 2010, through June 24, 2010.

11.2 <u>Subcontract Agreement Amendment, Intern Program, California State University, Fullerton Auxiliary Services Corporation</u>

The Board of Trustees approved the Subcontract Agreement Amendment for the intern program with California State University, Fullerton Auxiliary Services Corporation. The district serves as the Local Education Agency (LEA) for the intern grant with California State University, Fullerton (CSUF), which serves 53 school districts. Funding for this internship program is provided by the State of California to the district, and is passed through to CSUF Auxiliary Services Corporation. The amendment to the existing agreement extends the

period of performance of this subcontract through June 30, 2011, at no additional cost to the district. The amount of the pass through grant is \$100,560.29, July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2011. This agreement will be signed by CSUF Auxiliary Services Corporation following approval by the AUHSD Board of Trustees.

11.3 Labor Compliance Program Annual Report

This item was removed prior to the adoption of the agenda.

11.4 Paradigm HealthCare Service, LLC

The Board of Trustees approved an increase in the maximum fees paid to Paradigm Healthcare Service, LLC. On November 1, 2007, the board approved an agreement between Paradigm Health Care Service, LLC and the district, at a cost not to exceed \$50,000. The LEA Medi-Cal Program fees are based on a percentage, which is 15 percent, of the Medi-Cal billings to the Department of Health Services and the revenue received for the Medi-Cal Administrative Activities (MAA) reimbursement program. In 2008-09 the revenue from Medi-Cal billings was approximately \$322,000. The revenue from Medi-Cal billings for 2009-10 is approximately one million dollars, due to Paradigm resubmitting previously denied Medi-Cal claims. Since the fee is based on Medi-Cal billings, this has resulted in a considerable increase in the amount owed to Paradigm. The MAA program fees are based on the number of participants. The billing for the MAA program for the fiscal year 2009-10 is \$125 per participant, which increased from 26 in 2008-09 to 38 in 2009-10. The increase in revenue for the current fiscal year has resulted in an increase in the amount owed to Paradigm Health Care Service, LLC. The new cost will not exceed \$270,000. (General Funds)

11.5 Sole Source Justification for TeleParent Educational Systems', LLC

The Board of Trustees approved TeleParent Educational Systems', LLC as the sole source vendor for multilingual teacher-to-parent communication system and authorized administration to approve contracts for such as required. By action of the Board of Trustees on April 1, 2010, the consulting agreement with Jack Plicet was approved for a Sole Source Justification for TeleParent Educational Systems', LLC. Mr. Plicet recently finalized his report, which evaluated the district's need to facilitate attendance calling, emergency broadcasting, and community outreach from the classroom to homes in multiple languages. TeleParent patent-pending Situational Student Messaging (SSM) capabilities are what make the system unique and makes it easy for teachers to communicate any piece of information home to parents immediately and in the language spoken in the home with just a few clicks of the mouse. Mr. Plicet reported this is the most comprehensive solution for the district's requirements. The total amount of the contract exceeds the bid limit of \$78,600 (PCC 20111). By declaring TeleParent as the sole source, we meet legal bid requirements. Mr. Plicet's findings were documented in a three page report. His professional opinion is that the sole source provider of a multilingual teacher-to-parent communication tool for the district is TeleParent. This will also allow district administration to enter into contracts with TeleParent as required. (Various Funds)

11.6 Bid Extension, Promac Image Systems

The Board of Trustees approved an extension of the bid originally awarded to Promac Image Systems on June 4, 2009, pursuant to Bid #2009-27, for the lease of multi-function copier machines, June 17, 2010, through June 30, 2011. This is the second year of a five-year bid for the lease of copiers and service for district owned and rental copier machines, which are located at school sites and other district facilities. The terms shall remain the same as a month-to-month agreement, which includes service. The pricing is based on a cost per

copy, so the district only pays for each copy made. Copiers and service will be added and removed as required and based on the condition of the existing equipment. (Various Funds)

11.7 Award of Bids

On the motion of Mrs. Piercy, duly seconded and unanimously carried, following discussion, the Board of Trustees awarded the bids as listed.

^{*}The commissions paid to the district will be 58 percent of the gross sales of water and 35 percent of the gross sales of isotonics. The district will also receive \$20,000, as supplemental compensation, when the five-year contract is signed. All of the district's proceeds will be transferred to school site ASB accounts. This will enable the school site ASB to control the use of the vending machine funds, as was previously done with the vending machine proceeds.
