11.1 Interquest Detection Canines

11.3 <u>Resolution No. 2009/10-HR-02, Reinstatement of One Classified</u> ACTION ITEM <u>Position from the 2008-09 Reduction in Force</u> (Roll Call Vote)

The Board of Trustees is requested to adopt Resolution No. 2009/10-HR-02 to reinstate one classified position from the 2008-09 Reduction in Force. This part-time ASB Technician position is to provide accounting services at Hope School and Gilbert High School.

The Board of Trustees previously took action to reduce particular kinds of services provided by classified employees. This action was necessitated by the state-wide budget crisis and significant reductions in district revenues. District staff carried out the board's decision by using a selection process that involved seniority, in accordance with the requirements of the Education Code. **[EXHIBIT B]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt the resolution by a roll call vote.

11.4 <u>Resolution No. 2009/10-BOT-01, The U.S. and the World</u> ACTION ITEM <u>Education Act</u> (Roll Call Vote)

The Board of Trustees is requested to adopt Resolution No. 2009/10-BOT-01, The U.S. and the World Education Act. Jordan Brandman requested that the board consider the support of federal legislation that would create "The U.S. and the World Education Act," which is to be introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by Loretta Sanchez. The bill would fund competitive grants to eligible entities promoting international education instruction in elementary and secondary schools by increasing teacher competency in international education. The exhibit to this item includes a copy of the proposed bill and background information on the act. **[EXHIBIT C]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt the resolution by a roll call vote.

11.5 <u>Appointment of Board of Trustees' Representatives to the Board of Directors of the Anaheim Prep Sports/Activities Foundation</u>

ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to appoint three representatives to the Anaheim Prep Sports/Activities Foundation. The current Board of Directors of the Anaheim Prep Sports/Activities Foundation is reorganizing, consistent with the foundation's bylaws. The bylaws call for a 15 member board of directors, with three appointed by the AUHSD Board of Trustees and two appointed by the City Council of the city of Anaheim. Once those five directors are appointed, they may appoint additional directors. The bylaws indicate that one of the district's three directors shall be a member of the board, or his/her designee, and two shall be from the community at large. The bylaws indicate that directors hold office for one year and "need not be residents of the State of California."

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees take action to appoint its three representatives to the foundation.

11.6 Public Contract, E-Rate, Year 13

ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to receive the Schools and Libraries Program of the Universal Service Fund, commonly known as E-Rate, which is administered by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) under the direction of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). It provides discounts to assist most schools and libraries in the United States to obtain affordable telecommunications and Internet access. If this E-Rate funding is approved, the district would submit claims for the Priority II Equipment and Services. E-Rate will fund between 86 percent to 87 percent of eligible services.

The combined amount of equipment and services required by the district are expected to exceed the bid limit. Public Contract Code (PCC) Section 20118,2 enables the district to proceed with a competitive request for proposal for various types of network equipment and services at Anaheim, Western, and Savanna High Schools, as well as South and Sycamore Junior High Schools, and it will also allow for a new phone system at Anaheim High School. PCC Section 20118.2 states, "Due to the highly specialized and unique nature of technology, telecommunications, related equipment, software, and services, because products and materials of that nature are undergoing rapid technological changes, and in order to allow for the introduction of new technological changes into the operations of the school district, it is in the public's best interest to allow a school district to consider, in addition to price, factors such as vendor financing, performance reliability, standardization, life-cycle costs, delivery timetables, support logistics, the broadest possible range of competing products and materials available, fitness of purchase, manufacturer's warranties, and similar factors in the award of contracts for technology, telecommunications, related equipment, software, and services." This method for procurement of technology related equipment and services is commonly used by school districts. Piggyback bids provide an opportunity to purchase the designated items from various funding sources. This is why no specific funding source is designated. (E-Rate and Various Funds) [EXHIBIT D]

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the use of PCC 20118.2 to procure technology and telecommunications related equipment and services for E-Rate, Year 13 expenditures.

The Board of Trustees is requested to ratify the contract with Hewlett-Packard Company for the purchase of computer equipment, software, peripherals and the related services. The district has been using Hewlett-Packard products over the years, and our Information Systems department has established Hewlett-Packard products as the district standard because of their high quality and the reliable service it offers to the customers. The district has been utilizing the resources of the National Association of State Procurement Officials/Western States Contracting Alliance (NASPO/WSCA), the State of Minnesota, and the State of California contracts for these types of purchases. NASPO/WSCA is an alliance consisting of many states throughout the United States that provides its members with better purchasing power and deeply discounted prices. This contract is a "direct from the manufacturer" purchase, based on volume-discounted prices. The volume is being pooled with other members of the NASPO/WSCA alliance to obtain the lowest prices. Minnesota was the state that took the lead and processed a bid that resulted in an award of a contract to Hewlett-Packard Company.

Pursuant to the provisions of Public Contract Code Sections 10298, 10299, and 12100 et seq. utilizing the Master Price Agreement No. B27164 awarded by the NASPO/WSCA and approved for use by the State of California Department of General Services through the California Participating Addendum, purchases will be made on an as needed basis as staff requires products and associated peripherals and accessories to meet the information technology needs of students, faculty, and the district's business applications. It is difficult to project the exact amount that will be purchased, but an estimate of \$1,000,000 annually will be used as a baseline for a period not to exceed five years, effective September 1, 2009, through August 31, 2014. Piggyback bids provide an opportunity to purchase the designated items from various funding sources. This is why no specific funding source is designated. (Various Funds) **[EXHIBIT E]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the contract.

11.8 Agreement, The Regents of the University of California Mesa Schools Program (MSP)

ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to ratify Agreement No. 06-MSP-14 with The Regents of the University of California MESA Schools Program (MSP). The purpose of the agreement is to allow the MESA (Math, Engineering, Science Achievement) program for Orange County to be housed at the district office. Currently, the AUHSD has a highly successful program at Savanna High School. The MESA office will continue to support Savanna's program, as well as several others throughout the county. The cost of the program and housing for MESA is subsidized by the University of California Regents in this agreement. AUHSD will provide office space and communication support. The services are being provided July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2010. **[EXHIBIT F]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the agreement.

11.9 <u>Resolution No. 2009/10-E-01, Availability of Textbooks and Instructional Materials</u> (Roll Call Vote)

ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to adopt Resolution No. 2009/10-E-01, Textbook and Instructional Materials Compliance, per Education Code Section 60119. As required in the

Williams Settlement Legislation, the board held its annual public hearing on September 10, 2009, to determine if each pupil in the district has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials in history-social science, mathematics, reading, English language arts, science, health, and foreign languages. Textbooks and instructional materials are aligned to content and performance standards and are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board of Education. Board members will receive the results of the textbook distribution certification survey prior to the board meeting. **[EXHIBIT G]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt the resolution by a roll call vote.

11.10 <u>Certification No. 2009/10-E-01, Provision of Standards-Aligned</u> ACTION ITEM <u>Instructional Materials</u> (Roll Call Vote)

The Board of Trustees is requested to certify that every student has been issued a standards-aligned textbook or basic instructional material in each of the following areas: history-social science, mathematics, reading, English language arts, science, health, and foreign languages. This is an annual requirement in order to be in compliance with Williams Settlement Legislation. Every school principal was issued a survey instrument to determine and declare that every student in his/her school has been issued a textbook. Once the survey is completed, the principal's signature confirms that his/her survey was accurate. Legally, this certification is required before the district's Instructional Materials Funds Realignment Program (IMFRP) monies may be spent. The certification must be kept on file in the district for auditing purposes. **[EXHIBIT H]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees certify the provision by a roll call vote.

11.11 Appointment of Personnel Commissioner

ACTION ITEM

The Board of Trustees is requested to consider the appointment of one member to the personnel commission. The Board of Trustees appoints one member to the three member personnel commission and CSEA appoint one. These two appointees collectively appoint the third member.

The term of the current Board of Trustees' commissioner, Espiridion "Speed" Castillo, will end on November 30, 2009. The board may reappoint Mr. Castillo or solicit interest from other persons for the position. However, Mr. Castillo is interested in being reappointed. The term of the appointment will be December 1, 2009, through November 30, 2012.

Recommendation:

The Board of Trustees is requested to appoint a member to the personnel commission as it determines.

12.1 Agreement, Continuing Development Incorporated

Ratify the agreement with Continuing Development Incorporated (CDI). CDI administers the child care services for teen mothers attending classes at Trident Education Center utilizing funding from the California Department of Education Child Development Division. CDI will pay the district's direct costs for use of the facilities at the non-profit rate stated in the district's adopted facility use fee schedule. Services will be provided July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2014, at no cost to the district. **[EXHIBIT I]**

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees ratify the agreement.

12.2 Educational Consulting Agreement, San Diego County Superintendent of Schools

Approve the educational consulting agreement with the San Diego County Superintendent of Schools' Writing Reform Institute for Teaching Excellence (WRITE) for secondary English Language Development (ELD) and Spanish for Spanish Speakers teachers. WRITE Institute will provide trainer-of-trainers' training, data collection support, and training materials as part of an annual training cycle. This annual training cycle consists of an institute for AUHSD trainers, followed by three additional unit trainings for Spanish, and three additional units for ELD throughout the school year. AUHSD trainers will train and coach up to 27 additional participating ELD and Spanish teachers in Tier 2 of WRITE's secondary ELD program and Spanish for Spanish Speakers' program. This will result in more effective classroom implementation of curriculum and assessment, targeting optimum teacher effectiveness, student achievement, and systemic educational improvement as a component of AUHSD's English Language Development/English Language Arts/primary-language literacy efforts. Services will be provided September 28, 2009, through June 30, 2010, at a cost not to exceed \$23,000. (Title III Funds) [EXHIBIT J]

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the agreement.

12.3 Accrediting Commission for Schools, Western Association of Schools and Colleges

Approve the 2009-10 revisit fee to the Accrediting Commission for Schools, Western Association of Schools and Colleges. According to the conditions of the accreditation term, Gilbert High School will host a one-day midterm visit to document the progress of their six-year accreditation, at a cost not to exceed \$750. (General Funds)

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the fee.

12.4 <u>Disposal of Surplus Miscellaneous Furniture and Equipment</u>

Recommendation:

PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE SECTION 20118.2

- **20118**.2. (a) Due to the highly specialized and unique nature of technology, telecommunications, related equipment, software, and services, because products and materials of that nature are undergoing rapid technological changes, and in order to allow for the introduction of new technological changes into the operations of the school district, it is in the public's best interest to allow a school district to consider, in addition to price, factors such as vendor financing, performance reliability, standardization, life-cycle costs, delivery timetables, support logistics, the broadest possible range of competing products and materials available, fitness of purchase, manufacturer's warranties, and similar factors in the award of contracts for technology, telecommunications, related equipment, software, and services.
- (b) This section applies only to a school district's procurement of computers, software, telecommunications equipment, microwave equipment, and other related electronic equipment and apparatus. This section does not apply to contracts for construction or for the procurement of any product that is available in substantial quantities to the general public.
- (c) Notwithstanding Section **20118**.1, a school district may, after a finding is made by the governing board that a particular procurement qualifies under subdivision (b), authorize the procurement of the product through competitive negotiation as described in subdivision (d).
- (d) For purposes of this section, competitive negotiation includes, but is not limited to, all of the following requirements:
- (1) A request for proposals shall be prepared and submitted to an adequate number of qualified sources, as determined by the school district, to permit reasonable competition consistent with the nature and requirement of the procurement.
- (2) Notice of the request for proposals shall be published at least twice in a newspaper of general circulation, at least 10 days before the date for receipt of the proposals.
- (3) The school district shall make every effort to generate the maximum feasible number of proposals from qualified sources and shall make a finding to that effect before proceeding to negotiate if only a single response to the request for proposals is received.
- (4) The request for proposals shall identify all significant evaluation factors, including price, and their relative importance.
- (5) The school district shall provide reasonable procedures for the technical evaluation of the proposals received, the identification of qualified sources, and the selection for the award of the contract.
- (6) Award shall be made to the qualified bidder whose proposal meets the evaluation standards and will be most advantageous to the school district with price and all other factors considered.
- (7) If award is not made to the bidder whose proposal contains the lowest price, the school district shall make a finding setting forth the basis for the award.
- (e) The school district, at its discretion, may reject all proposals and request new proposals.
- (f) Provisions in any contract concerning utilization of small business enterprises, that are in accordance with the request for proposals, shall not be subject to negotiation with the successful proposer.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into between The Regents of the University of California, (hereinafter called "The Regents") and Anaheim Union High School District (hereinafter called the "Campus").

RECITALS

Whereas, The Regents are recipients of funding to be used by the Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) Program to maintain and establish the MESA Schools Program (MSP) at selected sites, and

Whereas, the Campus has been selected for the continuation or establishment of an MSP Center, and

NOW THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree as follows:

I. CAMPUS'S PRINCIPAL INVESTIGATOR AND CENTER DIRECTOR

Campus' Principal Investigator for conduct of work required herein is Dr. Frederick Navarro.

Campus' Center Director is Vonna Hammerschmitt.

The MESA Statewide Director of Program Operations shall be notified of any pending action that could result in the appointment or resignation of Principal Investigator or Center Director. Campus is responsible for assuring that the Center Director has annual performance evaluations per local Campus personnel policies.

II. THE REGENTS PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION REPRESENTATIVE

The Regents representative for program administration of this Agreement is Juanita Muñiz-Torres, MESA Statewide Director of Program Operations (address set forth in Article XVIII of this Agreement).

III. STATEMENT OF WORK

Campus shall perform services as described in its proposal [i.e., the MESA Annual Program Plan (MAPP)], including any approved revisions thereto. Campus approved MAPP is hereby incorporated by reference.

Funds provided To Campus from the MESA Statewide Office are to be used solely to support the MSP programs. MESA serves students from groups determined by the California Postsecondary Education Commission to have low four-year college eligibility rates, and students determined to be educationally disadvantaged. Campus shall use the following five categories of indicators for determining that students qualify as educationally disadvantaged: economic disadvantage indicators; program participation history/experience indicators; education environment indicators; academic preparation disadvantage indicators, and family/home environment disadvantage indicators. The selection of MESA program participants is the responsibility of the Campus MESA program center staff.

IV. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

This Agreement shall be in effect from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

Campus may request an extension of this Agreement using the MESA Approval Form, attached hereto as Exhibit B. Such request will provide a justification of the proposed extension, identify any unexpended funding, and specify how such funds are proposed to be used.

V. COST/BUDGET/PAYMENT/INTEREST

A. Program Cost and Funding

This Agreement provides complete funding for Campus operations from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010 in the amount of \$225,000, which consists of \$200,000 base funding. In addition, Campus will receive an allocation of \$15,000 for hosting the South Region MESA Day (for high schools), plus they will receive an allocation of \$10,000 for MESA Day Rules oversight and participation this year. The total operating budget for 2009-2010 is \$225,000.

The approved budget is incorporated herein as Exhibit A.

B. Budget

- 1. Indirect costs may be charged to this Agreement up to a maximum of 5% of total direct costs.
- 2. Campus shall expend funds as set forth in the Exhibit A. Campus may re-budget individual line items without prior approval up to 20% of the total annual amount provided by the Regents for those line items. Requests for re-budgeting exceeding this amount must be submitted to the MESA Statewide Director of Program Operations using Exhibit B, MESA Approval Form, with an explanation of why funds need to be redistributed and how they will be spent.
- 3. Funds remaining unexpended or un-obligated at the end of each fiscal year must be returned to the Regents with the annual financial report, unless the MESA Statewide Director permits Campus to apply unexpended funds toward the next program period. A request to carry forward funds must include: a) the amount left unexpended; b) an explanation as to why funds were not spent during the period of performance; and c) a narrative and budget on how they will be spent.
- 4. Additional funding may be provided on or after December 31, 2009 provided there has been adequate performance, timely submission of all required deliverables, and availability of funds to the Regents. Requirements for funding eligibility for future periods include the timely completion and submission of all Deliverables listed in Exhibit C.

C. Payment

\$225,000 shall be paid to Campus upon execution of this Agreement by The Regents

D. Interest

Interest earned on funds provided through this Agreement may be used for purposes of this Agreement only.

VI. FISCAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE STANDARDS

Allowable costs and administration shall be governed by standards as set forth in this Agreement and Office of Management and Budget circulars Nos. A-21 or A-122, as applicable, and A-110, in that order of precedence. (Note: Although funds used to support this Agreement are *non-federal*, reference to OMB Circulars is included here to take advantage of established institutional practices and procedures.)

VII. FINANCIAL, ACCOUNTING, RECORDS, REPORTS

- A. Campus shall maintain accurate accounts, records and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred in satisfaction of the terms of this Agreement.
- B. This Agreement shall be subject to examination and audit by The Regents and the State Auditor General for a period of three years after termination of this Agreement. The examination and audit shall be confined to those matters connected with the performance and administration of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the cost of administering the Agreement.
- C. Campus shall submit a financial report detailing expenditures for this project, including cash and inkind contributions from all sources, within 60 days of expiration or termination, whichever occurs first. Annual reports for each fiscal year (July 1 June 30) shall be submitted by August 24th of each year. If this Agreement is not amended to fund a full fiscal year of operations, the final annual report will be due on February 28th.

VIII. COLLECTION AND TRANSMISSION OF INFORMATION

Campus may not collect information by interview or by questionnaire from the public and represent that it is being collected by or for the MESA Statewide Office without the prior written approval of the MESA Statewide Office.

In accordance with <u>California Civil Code Section 1798.29</u>, any collection of data (e.g. electronic (database), or hard copy) containing personal identifying information such as social security number, name and address, must safeguard the personal identifying information. Campus agrees to implement appropriate safeguards in the collection of personal data in their local Campus system, and during transmission of such data to the MESA Statewide Office, and assumes responsibility for notification to Campus database subjects of security breaches, if any, as required by law.

IX. PUBLICATION AND ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SUPPORT

- A. Campus may publish results of its MSP Center activity accomplished under this Agreement, provided that such publications (printed, visual, or sound) contain 1) an acknowledgement of participation in the MESA organization administered and funded by The Regents and 2) a statement that findings, conclusions and recommendations are those of the author only and do not necessarily represent the views of the MESA Statewide Office. Two copies of all such publications must be furnished to the MESA Statewide Director of Program Operations following publication.
- B. Tangible results of MSP Center activity produced under this Agreement (i.e., productions, displays, exhibits, etc.) shall bear the following acknowledgement: "Financial support provided by the MESAsm Program of the Regents of the University of California."

X. <u>LICENSE, COPYRIGHT, SERVICE MARK. AND LOGO</u>

A. Title and Ownership of MESA Name and Materials:

It is understood that the MESA logo is a protected service mark that has been registered with the US Patent and Trademark Office and the California Secretary of State by The Regents.

It is further understood that The Regents hold the protected registered service mark to the MESA name, and all related names such as MSP, MSTC, MCCP, etc., and the copyright in materials of the MESA Model, including but not limited to the program's published operations manuals, handbooks, student database management system (DBMS) and accompanying user manual, videos, newsletters, and brochures hereinafter called "Licensed Materials." Licensed Materials are, and shall at all times remain the property of The Regents. The Regents shall own all right, title and interest in the Licensed Materials. Campus shall have no right, title, or interest in the MESA marks or in the Licensed Materials, except as expressly set forth in this Agreement.

B. Use of MESA Licensed Materials by Campus:

In fulfilling the duties and responsibilities under this Agreement, under the terms and conditions herein, Campus is authorized to use the MESA name and the MESA logo. It is agreed that the MESA logo will be used on all official documents and products in accordance with the MESA Statewide Logo Policy found at http://mesa.ucop.edu/logos/.

Campus may copy Licensed Materials, provided that such copies reproduce any and all copyright notices and service mark registration notices and acknowledge the MESA Statewide Office as the source. Campus shall not reproduce or distribute any copies of Licensed Materials outside of its own campus.

C. Materials Created by Campus arising out of MESA program; Licenses and Responsibilities:

As a member of the MESA California Network (MESA-NET), an informal association of MESA Licensees and other organizations, interested in and involved with implementing the MESA model, Campus shall permit The Regents and any MESA-NET member to use, reproduce, and distribute, without payment, any publishable material created by Campus arising out of Campus' MESA program, including copyrighted material. Such reproduction shall acknowledge Campus as source.

XI. PROGRESS REPORTS

Campus shall submit all deliverables as listed in Exhibit C, attached hereto.

XII. TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated without cause by either party upon 30 days prior written notice to the other party. Campus shall take all necessary measures to mitigate its costs and shall return to the Regents all unliquidated advance payments.

XIII. AMENDMENTS

Requests for No Cost Time Extensions, Carry-Forwards, Rebudgeting and changes in Principal Investigator and Center Director may be approved by the MESA Statewide Director of Program Operations upon request by Campus as described in Articles I, IV, and V. All other Amendments or modifications to this Agreement shall require execution on behalf of The Regents by the Executive Director of Strategic Sourcing or his designee, and shall be by the mutual consent of both parties in writing.

XIV. INSURANCE

Campus, at its sole cost and expense, shall insure its activities in connection with this Agreement and obtain, keep in force and maintain insurance as follows:

1. Commercial Form General Liability Insurance (contractual liability included) with limits as follows:

(a)	Each Occurrence	\$1,000,000
(b)	Products/Completed Operations Aggregate	\$3,000,000
(c)	Personal and Advertising Injury	\$1,000,000
(d)	General Aggregate	\$3,000,000

If the above insurance is written on a claims-made form, it shall continue for three (3) years following termination of this Agreement. The insurance shall have a retroactive date of placement prior to or coinciding with the effective date of this Agreement.

- 2. Business Automobile Liability Insurance for owned, scheduled, non-owned, or hired automobiles with a combined single limit no less than one million (\$1,000,000) per occurrence if using automobiles in conducting research under this Agreement.
- 3. Workers' Compensation as required under California State law.
- 4. Commercial Blanket Bond with a limit not less than the amount of grant funds provided by this Agreement in Campus' possession at any one time covering all employees of Campus, including coverage to protect money and securities as found in a Comprehensive Crime Policy.
- 5. Such other insurance in such amounts which from time to time may be reasonably required by the mutual consent of The Regents and Campus against other insurable risks relating to performance of the Agreement.
- 6. The coverages required under this Article shall not in any way limit the liability of Campus.

The coverages referred to under (1) and (2) of this Article shall include The Regents as an additional insured. Such a provision, however, shall apply only in proportion to and to the extent of the negligent acts or omissions of Campus, its officers, employees, and agents. A thirty (30)-day advance written notice (10 days for non-payment of premium) to The Regents of any modification, change or cancellation of any of the above insurance coverages is required. Upon the execution of this Agreement, Campus shall furnish The Regents with Certificates of Insurance (via an on-line system) evidencing Campus' insurance coverage and Additional Insured Endorsements demonstrating that The Regents are an additional insured on the applicable policies.

XV. INDEMNIFICATION

Campus shall defend, indemnify, and hold The Regents, its officers, employees, and agents harmless from and against any all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorney's fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorney's fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Campus, its officers, agents, or employees.

The Regents shall defend, indemnify, and hold Campus, its officers, employees, and agents harmless from and against any all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorney's fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorney's fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of The Regents, its officers, agents, or employees.

XVI. <u>AFFIRMATIVE ACTION/NON-DISCRIMINATION</u>

Campus agrees that when applicable, the following are incorporated herein as though set forth in full; the non-discrimination and affirmative action clauses contained in Executive Order 11246, as amended, relative to equal employment opportunity for all persons without regard to race, color, religion, sex or national origin, and the implementing rules and regulations contained in Title 41, part 60 of the Code of Federal Regulations, as amended; the non-discrimination and affirmative action clause contained in Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, relative to the employment and advancement in employment of qualified individual(s) with a disability without discrimination, and the implementing rules and regulations in Title 41, part 60-741 of the Code of Federal Regulations; the non-discrimination and affirmative action clause of the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974 relative to the employment and advancement in employment of qualified special disabled veterans, recently separated veterans. Vietnam era veterans, and veterans who served on active duty during a war or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign badge has been authorized, without discrimination, and the implementing rules and regulations in Title 41, part 60-250 of the Code of Federal Regulations; and the nondiscrimination clause required by California Government Code Section 12990 relative to equal employment opportunity for all persons without regard to race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition (cancer-related or genetic characteristics), marital status, sex, age, or sexual orientation, and the implementing rules and regulations of Title 2, Division 4, Chapter 5 of the California Code of Regulations.

XVII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Campus and its employees, consultants, agents, or independent contractors will perform all services under this Agreement as independent contractors. Nothing in this Agreement will be deemed to create an employer-employee or principal-agent relationship between The Regents and Campus's employees, consultants, agents, or independent contractors. Campus and its employees, consultants, agents and lower tier subawardees will not, by virtue of any services provided under this Agreement, be entitled to participate, as an employee or otherwise, in or under any employee benefit plan of The Regents or any employment right or benefit available to or enjoyed by employees of The Regents.

RESOLUTION NO. 2009/10-E-01

SEPTEMBER 24, 2009

On the motion of Trustee	and duly seconded,	the
following resolution was adopted:		

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119 and 60422(b), the Board of Trustees is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the school district, and bargaining unit leaders; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees is required to provide 10 days' notice of the public hearing or hearings; and

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district; and

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teachers and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the district, and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the State Board of Education for those subjects; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 10, 2009; and

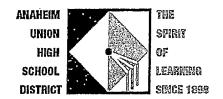

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN

ANAHEIM UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT AND

CONTINUING DEVELOPMENT INCORPORATED

THIS AGREEMENT is hereby made and entered into this 6th day of August, 2009, by and between Continuing Development Incorporated, a California non-profit corporation, 4340 Stevens Creek Blvd., Suite #260, San Jose, CA. 95129, hereinafter referred to as CDI, and the Anaheim Union High School District, 501 Crescent Way, Anaheim, California 92803, hereinafter referred to as DISTRICT. CDI and DISTRICT shall be collectively referred to as the Parties.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT wishes to continue to offer a child development program funded by the California Department of Education Child Development Division (CDOE-CDD) to provide child care services for children of teen mothers attending classes at the Trident Education Center, 1800 West Ball Road, Anaheim, California; and

WHEREAS, CDI is specially trained, experienced, and competent to provide the child care services required and is agreeable to administering the child care services utilizing funding from CDOE-CDD.

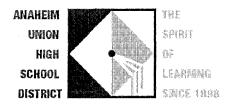
NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

1.0 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1.1 DISTRICT agrees to:
 - 1.1.1 Furnish and maintain classrooms and play space at Trident Education Center according to Title 22 regulations to enable CDI to perform its services hereunder.
 - 1.1.2 Provide utilities (excluding telephones) and custodial services for the classrooms and play space.
 - 1.1.3 Maintain the Trident Education Center site.
 - 1.1.4 Serve timely and adequate notice to CDI of any policy, procedural, or directive changes materially affecting the operation of CDI.

1.2 CDI agrees to:

- 1.2.1 Provide a child care program solely for the children of the teen mothers attending classes at the Trident Education Center.
- 1.2.2 Implement developmentally appropriate curriculum.
- 1.2.3 Employ, supervise, evaluate, and train CDI's staff.
- 1.2.4 Certify eligibility for the children of the teen mothers attending Trident Education Center.



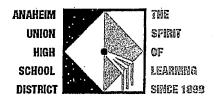
- 1.2.5 Administer the child care food program.
- 1.2.6 Purchase equipment and supplies necessary to perform its services hereunder.
- 1.2.7 Make no permanent modifications to district facilities without prior written approval of DISTRICT. CDI shall bear the full cost of any modifications to existing facilities which are necessary to meet the requirements of Title 22 and/or the requirements of CDI. CDI shall bear the full cost of removal of any unapproved modifications and restoration of the facility.
- 1.2.8 Exercise reasonable care for the property of DISTRICT and pay for any damage to DISTRICT property exclusive of normal wear and tear.
- 1.2.9 Serve timely and adequate notice to DISTRICT of any policy, procedural, or directive changes materially affecting the operation of DISTRICT.
- 2.0 AGREEMENT FOR USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES: CDI shall complete DISTRICT's use of facilities application and agreement process at least once per year no later than May 1st or more frequently as necessary. CDI shall be processed as an affiliated organization whose use is solely to serve the students of DISTRICT. The terms and conditions of the DISTRICT'S use of facilities agreement in effect at the time of use are incorporated herein by reference unless specifically superseded by this Agreement.
- 3.0 **PAYMENTS**: CDI shall pay DISTRICT's direct cost for the use of facilities at the rates for non-profits as stated in DISTRICT's adopted facility use fee schedule in effect at the time of use in accordance with Section 2.0. CDI shall not be required to pay an application fee or a deposit as otherwise required by the application and agreement for use of school facilities.
- 4.0 **TERM**: The term of this Agreement shall begin on July 1, 2009, and remain in effect until June 30, 2014, unless terminated by either party in accordance with Section 16.0.
- 5.0 **PERSONNEL**: CDI and DISTRICT shall retain complete and absolute authority over their respective staff members assigned to the Trident Education Center. Neither party has the authority to discipline, suspend, or terminate from employment, or take action against the other parties' staff members.
- 6.0 **FINGERPRINTING**: CDI hereby acknowledges that it is required to comply with the requirement of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to fingerprinting of employees who may have contact with DISTRICT's students. As required, CDI must provide for completion of a Fingerprint Certification form, in DISTRICT's required format, prior to any CDI employee coming into contact with DISTRICT's students.



- 7.0 **CONFIDENTIALITY**: CDI and DISTRICT shall maintain confidentiality of their respective records and information about persons pursuant to all applicable federal and/or state laws or regulations including, without limitation, the State of California Welfare and Institutions Code 10850 et seq., as each may now exist or be hereafter amended.
- 8.0 ACCESS TO RECORDS: CDI shall have access to books, documents, and records of DISTRICT pertinent to services performed in this Agreement for auditing and evaluation purposes. DISTRICT shall have access to books, documents and records of CDI pertinent to services performed in this Agreement for purposes of audit and evaluation. Each of the parties shall maintain and preserve all books, financial statements, journals, ledgers, and other pertinent documents for a period of five (5) years from the termination of this Agreement for any period required thereafter by statue.
- 9.0 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: CDI is and at all times to be an independent contractor and shall be wholly responsible for the manner in which the services required by the terms of this Agreement are performed. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee, or principal and agent, between CDI and DISTRICT. CDI assumes the responsibility for the acts of its employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided. CDI, its officers, agents and employees shall not be entitled to any rights, and/or privileges of DISTRICT's employees and shall not be considered in any manner to be DISTRICT'S employees.

10.0 INDEMNIFICATION:

- 10.1 CDI hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend DISTRICT, its officers, agents and employees from liability and claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease or death of any person or persons, or damage to property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents or officers of CDI during the period of this Agreement and shall pay for and satisfy any judgment that may be rendered against them In any action, suit, or other proceeding as a result thereof.
- 10.2 DISTRICT hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend CDI and its officers, agents and employees from liability and claims of liability for bodily injury, sickness, disease or death of any person or persons, or damage to property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents or officers of DISTRICT during the term of this Agreement and shall pay for and satisfy any judgment that may be rendered against them in any action, suit, or other proceeding as a result thereof.



- 11.0 **INSURANCE**: CDI agrees that it shall maintain insurance and provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance as proscribed by the Agreement for Use of School Facilities per Section 2.0.
- 12.0 **AFFIRMATIVE ACTION EMPLOYMENT**: CDI agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination of persons because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such persons.
- 13.0 **LAWS, RULES, & REGULATIONS**: CDI and DISTRICT shall each keep themselves fully informed and in compliance with all applicable local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations which affect their own duties and responsibilities under this agreement in any manner.
- 14.0 **ASSIGNMENT**: CDI shall not subcontract or assign the performance of any of the services in this Agreement without prior written approval of the DISTRICT.
- 15.0 **NO THIRD PARTY RIGHTS**: This Agreement shall not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third part except as expressly provided herein.
- 16.0 **TERMINATION**: This Agreement may be terminated by CDI or DISTRICT with or without cause, upon the giving of sixty (60) days prior written notice to the other party.
- 17.0 **NOTICES**: All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: a) Personal service, or b) U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or, if mailed, on the third (3rd) day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. 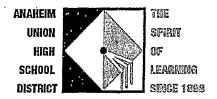

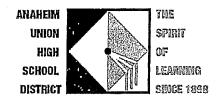

For breach or violation of this warranty, DISTRICT shall have the right to rescind this Agreement without liability.
- 22.0 **EXHIBITS AND RECITALS**: All exhibits and recitals contained herein and attached hereto are material parts of this Agreement and are incorporated as if fully set forth herein by this reference.
- 23.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT/AMENDMENT: This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement between CDI and DISTRICT regarding the services and any agreement made shall be ineffective to modify this Agreement in whole or in part unless such agreement is embodied in an Amendment to this Agreement, which has been signed by both Parties. This Agreement supersedes all prior negotiations, understandings, representations and agreement.
- 24.0 **AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE**: The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of their respective Parties represent and warrant that they have the authority to do so under law and from their respective Parties.

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this

WHEREAS the District is in need of special services and advice;

WHEREAS such services and advice are not available at no cost from public agencies; and

WHEREAS Consultant is specially trained, experienced, and competent to provide the special services and advice required; and

WHEREAS such services are needed on a limited basis.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Services to be provided by Consultant:

The San Diego County Superintendent of Schools' Writing Reform Institute for Teaching Excellence (WRITE) Institute will provide trainer-of-trainers training, data collection support, and training materials as part of an annual training cycle. This annual training cycle consists of an institute for AUHSD trainers, followed by three additional unit trainings for Spanish and three additional units for ELD throughout the school year. AUHSD trainers will train and coach up to 27 additional participating ELD and Spanish teachers in Tier 2 of WRITE's secondary ELD program and the Spanish for Spanish Speakers program. This will result in more effective classroom implementation of curriculum and assessment, targeting optimum teacher effectiveness, student achievement, and systemic educational improvement as a component of AUHSD's English Language Development/English Language Arts/primary-language literacy.

The notice shall be deemed given when received or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- 7. Consultant agrees to and shall hold harmless and indemnify District, its officers, agents, and employees from every claim or demand and every liability or loss, damage, or expense of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
 - a. Liability for damages for death or bodily injury to person, injury to property, or any other loss, damage, expense sustained by Consultant or any person, firm, or corporation employed by Consultant upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of District, its officers, employees, or agents.
 - b. Any injury to or death of persons or damage to property, sustained by any persons, firm, or corporation, including the District, arising out of, or in any way connected with the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off school district

property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District, its officers, employees, or agents.

Consultant, at Consultant's expense, cost, and risk, shall defend any and all actions, suits, or other proceedings that may be brought or instituted against the District, its officers, agents, or employees on any such claim, demand, or liability and shall pay or satisfy any judgment/lawsuit reimbursement that may be rendered against the District, its officers, agents, or employees in any action suit, or other proceedings as a result thereof.

- 8. This AGREEMENT is not assignable without written consent of the parties hereto.
- 9. Consultant and assistants shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances, including Worker's Compensation.
- 10. Consultant, if an employee of another public agency, certifies that Consultant shall not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to the AGREEMENT.
- 11. The following is a brief description of what will be achieved by Consultant as a result of this AGREEMENT:

The San Diego County Superintendent of Schools' WRITE Institute will train five lead trainers who, in turn, will train and coach up to 27 ELD and Spanish for Spanish Speakers teachers to implement WRITE units in the updated courses being offered during the 2009-10 school year at 15 AUHSD schools. The purpose of expanding Spanish for Spanish Speakers is to support English Language Development as well as sophisticated, academic Spanish Language competency, moving native-Spanish speakers towards passage of AP Spanish Language and AP Spanish Literature examinations in high school. Currently, the Spanish Language Arts component of WRITE Institute's Biliteracy model is training many teachers across the state via professional development hosted by the Los Angeles, San Diego and San Joaquin County Offices of Education. AUHSD will have the capacity to sustain the training without sending participating teachers to the county offices.

12. What are the technical reasons Consultant is being hired as an Independent Contractor rather than an employee?

The lead trainers of WRITE Institute are employees of the San Diego County Office of Education, and are not available to be hired directly by the Anaheim Union High School District. The purpose of the training model is to train AUHSD staff, who will then train AUHSD teachers.

Since the training for the lead trainers will be held offsite, only email and internet access to WRITE sites will be required; otherwise, no technical support will be required. For training implementation within the district, only the usual presentation-related technology will be required.

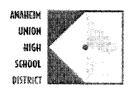

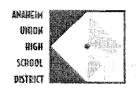
