Accidents are undesirable, unplanned occurrences which often result in bodily harm, loss of school time, property damage, possibly expensive legal action, and even death. Thus, it shall be the policy of the Anaheim Union High School District to take every reasonable precaution for the safety of the students, employees, visitors, patrons, and all others having business with this school district. The Board of Trustees believes that safety is important to everyone concerned with our schools, not only as a protective measure during school hours, but also as an instructional means of developing an appropriate mode of behavior to minimize accidents at all times.

It shall be the responsibility of the district's superintendent to implement this policy, and in order to have a comprehensive program which will meet the needs of the Anaheim Union High School District:

- 1. The responsibility for developing the total safety program shall be delegated to a competent, professional staff person who will be directly responsible to the superintendent, and shall be provided with staff, time, budget, authority, commensurate with the task.
- 2. This staff person, acting in an advisory capacity to all personnel within the district shall be responsible for the promotion and development of an aggressive accident prevention and safety education program for professional and non-professional personnel employed by the district.
- 3. The general areas of responsibility include, but are not limited to, in-service training, accident record keeping, plant inspection, driver education, vehicle safety programs, fire prevention, school site selection, emergency procedures, and traffic safety problems related to employees, pupils, and community.
