All administration of the food services program will be coordinated under the direction of the Superintendent or the appropriate designee. Business functions to be centralized include purchasing of food and supplies, a district-wide salary schedule for all food service employees, centrally planned menus, and auditing procedures of all accounts.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures whereby students may participate in the selection of foods of good nutritional quality for school menus.

"Offer vs. Serve" is an option which allows students to decline meal items which they do not intend to consume while still allowing the meal to qualify for reimbursement under the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

To the extent permitted under the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs, students in all grades shall be allowed to decline parts of their meal which they do not intend to consume.
