

The Board of Trustees authorizes the granting of credit for certain courses and learning experiences completed in schools not under the jurisdiction of the Anaheim Union High School District.

The principal will grant such credit based on the determination of whether the courses or experiences are equivalent in time and content to those specified in the Key to Learning and earned in a state accredited public or private school within or outside the United States. In the state of California, this accreditation is referred to as WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges).

The Board of Trustees directs the superintendent or designee to prepare and review annually administrative rules and regulations for granting of such credit.

Administrative regulations for granting of credit are found in the Key to Learning.
