Recognizing the need for staff and community involvement in the development and review of curriculum and instructional strategies, the Board of Trustees authorizes the establishment of a District Curriculum and Instruction Task Force. The task force shall be comprised of:

- 1. The assistant superintendent, Education, chairperson.
- 2. One director selected by the assistant superintendent, Education.
- 3. One principal to be selected yearly by the superintendent. (The principal will alternate every year between the junior high school and the senior high.
- 4. One assistant principal selected yearly by the superintendent. (Will alternate between senior high school and junior high school yearly.
- 5. One counselor selected yearly by the superintendent in consultation with APGA. (Will alternate between junior high and senior high school.
- 6. Three teachers to be selected yearly by the superintendent in consultation with Anaheim Secondary Teachers Association.
- 7. Parents/patrons selected yearly by the superintendent in consultation with the Board of Trustees. These parents/patrons are to be selected so that all schools in the district have representation on the committee.
- 8. One classified employee selected by the superintendent in consultation with the classified employee associations.

The selection of the members of the District Curriculum and Instruction Task Force will take place in September for service in the new school year.

The purpose of the District Curriculum and Instruction Task Force will be:

- 1. To review, study, and propose improvement in curriculum and instruction on a district-wide basis.
- 2. To serve as a communication vehicle to inform all members of the educational community of proposed additions, deletions, or changes in curriculum and instruction.

All meetings will be called by the assistant superintendent, Education, when needed or by request of two-thirds of the membership of the task force. Any member of the task force may submit agenda items. Meeting notices and agendas will be made available to area newspapers and posted in all school and the District Education Center. The meetings of the task force will be open to the public. Meetings will be held at least three times each year. Released time for district employees who are task force members will be available when determined to be necessary by the assistant superintendent, Education. Minutes of the meeting will be posted at all schools and be sent to the Board of Trustees, Executive Staff, curriculum administrators and employee associations.
