Junior High School:

Students who have successfully completed the sixth grade and those students who are, in the judgment of the junior high school principal and of the superintendent or assistant superintendents having immediate jurisdiction thereof, and are capable of doing the required work, may be admitted to junior high school. In most cases, students will have attained their twelfth birthday on or before December 1st 2nd of the given school year. Students must follow the appropriate sequence of elementary grade levels before being eligible to be admitted to junior high school. Thirteen year old students should be enrolled in either the 7th or 8th grade based upon academic status. The recommendation should come from the elementary principal to the junior high principal and from the elementary superintendent or designee to the superintendent or assistant superintendent, education. The recommendation would include assessment of skills and concepts and a description of academic and social readiness. The final decision rests with the superintendent or assistant superintendent, education for the superintendent, education for the superintendent, education for assistant superintendent, education.

Senior High School:

Students entering 9th grade must have a combined total GPA of 2.0 for 7th and 8th grade and 100 credits/6 period day, 120 credits/7 period day, or 140 credits/ 8 period day of required and elective classes. It is anticipated that these students will have a 90% positive attendance record.

Students entering 10th, 11th, or 12th grade will be placed in the appropriate educational setting based upon credits, GPA, attendance. discipline and individual needs.
