

Tutoring for Pay

The principal and teachers will make every effort to resolve student learning problems before recommending that parents engage a tutor or seek other professional help. The Board of Trustees believes that by maintaining a high quality instructional staff and providing for a rich varied curriculum the need for individual tutoring is minimized.

In exceptional cases, when individual tutoring is determined to be necessary, it shall be carried out in accordance with regulations established by the superintendent. Such regulations will be designed to protect both the district and the teachers from charges of conflict of interest.

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Tutoring

The following regulations will be observed when it is found necessary to tutor students for pay:

1. A teacher may not accept remuneration for tutoring any pupil enrolled in his/her class.
2. Tutoring for which a teacher receives a fee will not be carried on in a district school building.
3. Teachers who accept tutoring positions will make their own arrangements with the parents for the fees to be charged.

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
